**RE: PDC - Olguin, Pedro: Alleged violation of RCW 42.17A.235 for failure to file reports of campaign contributions and expenditures (June 2017).**

Dear Mr. Blackhorn:

My name is Pedro E. Olguin, Candidate for Burien City Council, Position 1. I am writing in respond to the abovementioned complaint filed with your office.

Regarding Mr. Morgan's allegation on failure to file timely, he is correct. My campaign failed to report in a timely fashion the contributions and expenditures we have incurred.

I apologize for this oversight, it is my first time running for office. That said, my campaign finance manager has taken the necessary steps to be in full compliance with PDC reporting requirements.

In the future, we will take the necessary steps to file in a timely manner.

On Mr. Morgan's accusation of non-residency: I am a Burien resident and able to run for office, per the municipal code. This is a false allegation. Should Mr. Morgan chose to challenge my residency status, he should file the appropriate complaint with King County elections.

Additionally, Mr. Morgan has filed this complaint with your office to dissuade traditionally marginalized communities of color from running for elected position. He lodges complaints against all candidates supported by social justice organizations, primarily labor unions, as a means to further disenfranchise underrepresented communities. That is his principal job with the Freedom Foundation, an anti-worker political organization.

We hope that in making your final determination, consider the mitigating circumstances and the corrective action I've taken to comply with PDC requirements on the late reporting of monies received and paid.


