16	II. FINDINGS OF FACT
17	1. Warren Small was elected School Director for the Royal School District 160 in 2013.
18	1. Warren Sman was created sensor Breetor for the Royal School Bistrict 100 in 2013.
19	2. Per RCW 42.17A.700, Mr. Small was required to file a Personal Financial Affairs
20	Statement (F-1 report) disclosing personal financial information for calendar year 2017 no later
21	than April 16, 2018.
22	3. From April to June of 2018, PDC staff sent seven email reminders to Mr. Small
23	concerning the F-1 filing requirement.
24	concerning the F-1 Ining requirement.
25	4. On July 16, 2018 PDC staff sent a warning letter by U.S. Mail, concerning Mr.
26	Small's failure to file the F-1 report.

1	6. On August 16, 2018, PDC staff served Mr. Small by U.S. mail and email, with a
2	hearing notice for a Brief Adjudicative Proceeding to be held on September 24, 2018,
3	concerning the failure to timely file the F-1 report.

5	7. On September 24, 2018, a Brief Adjudicative Proceeding was held in which the
6	Presiding Officer determined that, in accordance with WAC 390-37-143(5), Mr. Small's case
7	needed to be scheduled before the full Commission for an enforcement action as:
8	 He was found in violation in the previous reporting period;
9	The violation remained in effect following any appeals; and
10	 He had not filed the disclosure form that was the subject of the prior violation.

12	8. On October 15, 2018, PDC staff served Kevin Small by U.S. mail and email, with a
13	hearing notice for an Adjudicative Proceeding before the full Public Disclosure Commission, to
14	be held on October 25, 2018, concerning the failure to timely file the F-1 report.
15	9. As of the date of the Review Hearing, Mr. Small had not filed the missing F-1 report
16	for calendar year 2017.
17	
18	10. Warren Small failed to timely file an F-1 report for calendar year 2015, which was
19	due no later than April 15, 2016 (PDC Case 10083). At the January 20, 2017, Brief Adjudicative
20	Proceeding, Mr. Small was found in violation of RCW 42.17A.700 and assessed a \$250 penalty
21	for failing to timely file an F-1 report, which was due no later than April 15, 2016. As of the
22	October 24, 2018 hearing, Mr. Small had not paid the \$250 civil penalty for PDC Case 10083
23	and had not filed the missing F-1 report for calendar year 2015.
24	11. Warren Small failed to timely file an F-1 report for calendar year 2016, which was
25	
26	due no later than April 15, 2017 (PDC Case 22181). At the August 23, 2017 Brief Adjudicative

1	Proceeding, Mr. Small was found in violation of RCW 42.17A.700 and assessed a \$550 penalty
2	for failing to timely file an F-1 report, which was due no later than April 15, 2017. Mr. Small
3	paid the \$550 civil penalty on September 26, 2017. On October 11, 2017, Mr. Small filed the
4	F-1 report for calendar 2016 that was due April 17, 2017.
5	
6	IV. CONCLUSIONS OF LAW
7	1. The Commission has jurisdiction over this proceeding pursuant to Chapter 42.17A
8	RCW, the State campaign finance and disclosure law; Chapter 34.05 RCW, the Administrative
9	Procedure Act; and Title 390 WAC.
10	
11	2. Respondent violated RCW 42.17A.700 by failing to file a Personal Financial Affairs
12	Statement (F-1 Report) disclosing personal financial information for calendar year 2017 no later
13	than April 16, 2018.
14	
15	V. ORDER
16	Based upon the Findings and Conclusions, the Commission Orders that:
17	1. Respondent Warren Small is assessed a total civil penalty of \$1,500 for violation
18	of RCW 42.17A.700, payable within 30 days of the date of this Order.

20	2. Respondent shall also pay all prior PDC civil penalties, file the F-1 reports for
21	calendar years 2015 and 2017, and remain in compliance with all PDC reporting
22	requirements.
