

File a Formal Complaint - Glen Morgan

To Whom it May Concern --

It has come to my attention that Tony Anderson (SeaTac City Council) has violated numerous provisions of **RCW 42.17A**, Washington State's campaign finance law.

1) Failure to accurately disclose ownership of a PERS retirement account as an asset. (Violation of RCW 42.17A.700, see WAC 390-24-010)

State law requires that elected officials disclose the assets that they own on their F1 statement if they are over a certain value.

Anderson failed to report the value of his PERS retirement account (Stemming from employment with Port of Seattle and City Council in Seatac), which is an asset.

The value of Anderson's PERS retirement account is almost certainly over \$2400, as he was a longtime public employee of the Port of Seattle before he was fired for watching pornography on the job when he was supposed to be investigating a drive-by shooting that resulted in a double homicide.

Anderson must be required to amend this form to include accurate information.

2) Failure to acknowledge understanding of RCW 42.17A.555. (Violation of RCW 42.17A.700 (7))

State law requires that incumbents for public office check a box on their F1 acknowledging applicable statutes prohibiting misuse of public money for campaign purposes.

On his F1 covering 2015, Anderson did not check this box – a violation of state law.

Anderson must submit an amended F1 to fix this error immediately.

3) Failure to disclose offices held. (Violation of RCW 42.17A.700, see WAC 390-24-010, 150)

State law requires that elected officials disclose the positions that they hold on corporations.

By his own admission, Tony Anderson is a board member of the organization "Puget Sound Access".

Unfortunately, he failed to report this on his F1, which is also a violation of state law.

4) Inaccurate code for describing salary from City of SeaTac. (Violation of RCW 42.17A.710)

On his 2015 and 2016 F1s, Anderson used the "C" code to describe his salary from the City of SeaTac.

"C" code represents values between \$24,000 and \$47,999.

According to public records, Anderson in 2015 and 2016 received compensation roughly at \$18,000, well below the \$24,000 indicated by the "C" code.

Anderson must fix this error immediately.

5) Failure to timely file Statement of Organization (C1/C1PC). (Violation of RCW 42.17A.205 (1))

State law requires that candidates file their C1 within 2 weeks of receiving contributions or making expenditures, whichever is earliest.

Tony Anderson has publically announced to many in SeaTac that he is running for re-election in 2017, however he has failed to file his C1. He must file this form immediately and begin filing regular, accurate reports with the PDC.

The PDC should investigate the possibility that Anderson committed the above violations maliciously, which would be a class C felony per **RCW 42.17A.750 (2)(c)**. If the PDC determines that is the case, they should refer the case to the Attorney General's office for criminal prosecution immediately.
