

File a Formal Complaint - Glen Morgan

To Whom it May Concern --

It has come to my attention that Bailey Stober, who works for King County Assessor John Wilson has committed numerous violations of RCW 42.17A.555

1) Illegal use of public agency time to campaign. (Violation of RCW 42.17A.555)

State law prohibits public employees from campaigning during work hours.

After searching for only an hour, I was able to find no fewer than 21 instances where Stober had illegally campaigned during work hours. (See attachment.) Many of these instances were related to his role as Chair of the King County Democrats.

This role is unrelated to and incompatible with the work that taxpayers expect him to perform during those same work hours.

Most recently, Stober illegally campaigned during work hours by sharing an invitation to Dow Constantine's upcoming 3/27/17 campaign fundraiser. In addition to posting the invitation, Stober wrote: "I hope you will join my boss and I along with 16 Mayors and Council members to support the re-election of our fantastic County Executive Dow Constantine! Dow is an incredible leader who deserves 4 more years. His innovation, drive and work ethic is second to none. "

That post was made on Wednesday 3/1/17 @ 4:05 PM, which is still during taxpayer funded working hours, even at the King County Assessor's office.

Additionally, it should be noted that if Stober actually planned to attend this Bellevue fundraiser, he would likely have to leave work early to get there on time.

Stober also made posts that were derisive to the constituents he is expected to serve, but there is no law against that.

Please note that I believe these violations are only the "tip of the iceberg" as far as Bailey Stober is concerned. When I have documentation of additional violations, I will file them as a follow-up addendum with the PDC. Since the violation is already clear with this complaint and further evidence merely reinforces this original complaint allegations, it seems efficient that these additional examples will simply provide further material support to this complaint.



As many of you know, several Precinct Committee Officers (PCOs) in the 37th Legislative District filed suit against the King County Democrats and the King County Council. Additionally, they filed for a temporary restraining order (TRO). They did this in an effort to stop our organization and the King County Council from appointing a new State Senator in the 37th District. They believed that we should have allowed appointed PCOs to vote in this process, which our bylaws did not allow for. During the first hearing a Judge ruled in favor of the King County Democrats and against the plaintiffs. This allowed the County Council to appoint a Senator to the vacant seat. The hearing was scheduled to continue today, December 23rd, as the plaintiffs now wanted the court to nullify the vote of the County Council and hold a new vote among PCOs in the 37th. I am pleased to say after weeks of negotiations, the King County Democrats have prevailed. This morning the plaintiff submitted a motion to dismiss their lawsuit with prejudice. In exchange, the King County Democrats will submit a resolution to the Washington State Democrats Rules Committee respectfully requesting the strengthening and clarification of our bylaws language for future appointments. My first decision as Chair was to allow the 37th District elected PCOs the opportunity for their voice to be heard – I am proud that I affirmed that decision and I stand by it today. Our organization will not use any other method of trying to influence the outcome of democratic

The officers of the King County Democrats feel deeply saddened by the events that occurred during our recent reorganization meeting. During the election of the Chair, a nominated candidate rose solely for the purpose of launching negative attacks against another candidate for Chair, and concluded by withdrawing from consideration. This not only violates our rules but it violates our core beliefs as Democrats and has caused division in our community by both the tactic and some of the language used.

The meetings conducted by our party are to conduct official business. They are not for personal vendettas and they are certainly not for doing anything that would attack another person. As a party, we have prided ourselves on being inclusive and compassionate. We have claimed that we are the party of the people, that we can respect people's differences and that we are better than our Republican counterparts. The behavior demonstrated Sunday is just the opposite. Instead of taking this opportunity to show new precinct committee officers what we stand for -- we showed them that we are not above the fray.

At the King County Democrats, we will ensure this type of behavior does not occur again and in the event we see it -- we will call it out and demand that it stop. People that participate in this behavior will be asked to leave and we will explore other disciplinary actions.

Our rules will be followed. Comments will be directed at the Chair. Members will not be granted the opportunity to disparage other members in their comments. If they do, they will be asked to stop, if it continues they will be asked to leave.

This incident showed our need to be more visible allies for the Muslim, Arab, and other vulnerable populations who are under increasing pressures in today's political climate. We also need to talk it very seriously when members do not feel safe within our party. We cannot and will not silence those who are in fear but instead we will work with them to find appropriate avenues to resolving the situation. We respect everyone's feelings. As a result, we will partner with a nonprofit dispute resolution service that will work with our members to resolve issues. We encourage both parties in this specific event to take part in a dispute resolution service.

We do not condone or appreciate negative campaigning. It doesn't matter if it is internal or the way we run public campaigns -- negative campaigning has no part within the King County Democrats. We will call it out when we see it and we will ask you to stop.

Finally, we ask you to revisit one of the oldest rules of thumb. Treat others how you want to be treated. If you want to be treated like you are a valuable, wanted, appreciated human being -- that is how we are going to ask you and expect you to treat other people both inside and outside of our party.
