Re: Request for Review/Reconsideration from Peter Swant: PDC Case 10086

**Agenda Item**

Peter Swant is seeking a review/reconsideration by the Commission of a final order entered in a Brief Enforcement Hearing held January 20, 2017 in PDC Case 10086. The reconsideration is scheduled for the March 23, 2017, Commission meeting.

**Background**

- Mr. Swant is an incumbent Port Commissioner for the Port of Walla Walla, since being elected to that position in 2013.
- As an incumbent Port Commissioner, Mr. Swant was required to file a Personal Financial Affairs Statement (F-1 report) no later than April 15, 2016. Mr. Swant failed to file either an F-1 or F-1A report for calendar year 2015.
- On July 6, 2016, PDC staff sent an F-1 warning letter to Mr. Swant at the following mailing address: 218 West Main Street, Walla Walla, WA 99362. This is the mailing address that was submitted to PDC staff by the Port of Walla Walla. (Note – this is the address for Coldwell Banker First Realtors in Walla Walla, where Mr. Swant is employed).
- On December 1, 2016, PDC staff sent a Brief Enforcement Hearing Notice to Mr. Swant by US mail to 218 West Main Street, Walla Walla, WA 99362.
- Mr. Swant has two prior PDC violations in the last five years, PDC Cases 14-110 and 16-064. In both of those cases, Mr. Swant filed the missing F-1 report, completed a Statement of Understanding (SOU), and paid a \$100 penalty in lieu of having an enforcement hearing held. The details are as follows:
  1. On July 11, 2014, Mr. Swant submitted a completed SOU, paid a \$100 penalty, and electronically filed his missing F-1 report on July 7, 2014 for calendar year 2013.
  2. On August 5, 2015, Mr. Swant submitted a completed SOU, paid a \$100 penalty, and paper-filed his missing F-1 report on August 3, 2015 for calendar year 2014.

- On January 20, 2017, a Brief Enforcement Hearing was held in which the Presiding Officer found Mr. Swant in violation of RCW 42.17A.700 for failing to file an F-1 report for calendar year 2015, and assessed a \$1,000 civil penalty, payable in accordance with WAC 390-37-160 within 30 days of the date of the Order.
- The initial Order was entered February 3, 2017.

### **Request for Review/Reconsideration**

- On February 14, 2017, Mr. Swant sent an email to the PDC through the Freshdesk Portal after receiving the Order for the January 20, 2017 Brief Enforcement hearings, requesting that the Commission review the \$1,000 penalty assessed against him.
- Mr. Swant included with his February 14, 2017, email request for review, a completed F-1 report for calendar year 2015, a marked-up signed SOU, and a marked-up copy of a December 1, 2016, Brief Enforcement hearing notice.
- Mr. Swant stated in his request for review, that the hearing notice sent out by PDC staff “must have been sent to the wrong address” since it was forwarded to him on December 19, 2016. He noted that he was at fault for not “responding promptly” to the hearing, but questioned the fairness of assessing a \$1,000 penalty that amounted to more than five percent of his \$18,000 annual salary as a Port Commissioner. He requested that the Commission “reduce my penalty to something more fair to me” and suggested a range of \$150-\$250.

### **Staff Comments**

The mailing address used by PDC staff to send the F-1 warning letters and hearing notices to Mr. Swant for the two prior PDC violations for PDC Cases 14-110 and 16-064 was the same mailing address that staff used this year, 218 West Main Street, Walla Walla, WA 99362.

A PDC spreadsheet indicated that the December 1, 2016 hearing notice was returned or “bounced back” and that the notice was resent to Mr. Swant at an alternative address. It appears that staff forwarded the hearing notice to Mr. Swant at 707 E. Tietan, Walla Walla, WA 99362, which is the next most recent address in the PDC database. A handwritten note on the hearing notice by PDC staff member Jacob Berkey states that the hearing notice was forwarded to Mr. Swant on December 14, 2016. Mr. Swant wrote a handwritten note on the hearing notice stating that he received it on December 20, 2016.

Lets see the minimum wage for Washington State is \$11.50 an hour. Boy I must be do for a wage increase. I don't do this job for the money! I do it because I want to contribute something back to the community, for all this community has done for me and my 3rd Generation Family. Our sole purpose at the port is and I quote "Working to enhance the economic vitality of Walla Walla County through the creation and retention of family wage jobs"

So in closing I would request that you reduce my penalty to something much more Fair to me. \$150-\$250???? I'm going to scan all the documents I have for you today. I will also put them in a envelope and get it in the mail today. Please honor my requests in the future that anything that pertains to the Port be mailed to the Port. Thank you for your time and attention to this request.

The Public Disclosure Commission (PDC) has not received your Personal Financial Affairs Statement (F-1 report) disclosing financial activities for calendar year 2015. RCW 42.17A.700 requires every elected or appointed official to file an annual F-1 report, which was to have been filed no later than April 15, 2016. On July 6, 2016, PDC staff sent you a reminder letter to file the missing F-1 report.

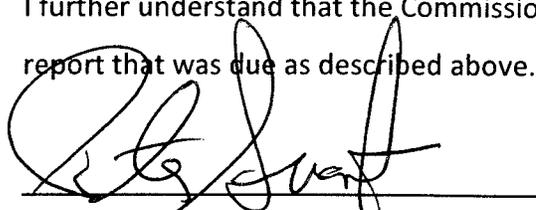

A brief enforcement hearing (brief adjudicative proceeding) was held on January 20, 2017, in Room 206, Evergreen Plaza Building, 711 Capitol Way, Olympia, Washington to consider whether the Respondent violated RCW 42.17A.700 by failing to file a Personal Financial Affairs Statement (F-1 report) as an incumbent official, which was due to be filed not later than April 15, 2016, disclosing financial activities for calendar year 2015.

The hearing was held in accordance with Chapters 34.05 and 42.17A RCW and Chapter 390-37 WAC. A brief enforcement hearing notice was sent to Peter Swant on December 1, 2016. Commission Chair Anne Levinson was the Presiding Officer. The Commission staff was represented by Kurt Young, Compliance Officer. The Respondent did not participate in the hearing or submit any written materials.

Having considered the evidence, the Presiding Officer finds as follows:

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. The Respondent is an incumbent Port Commissioner for the Port of Walla Walla, since being elected to that position in 2013.
2. As an incumbent Port Commissioner, the Respondent was required to file an F-1 report no later than April 15, 2016.
3. The Respondent did not file the missing F-1 report by the date of the hearing.
4. The Respondent has two prior PDC violations in the last five years, PDC Case 14-110 and 16-064.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

Based on the above facts, as a matter of law, the Presiding Officer concludes as follows:

1. This matter was duly and properly convened and all jurisdictional, substantive and procedural requirements have been satisfied.
2. The Respondent violated RCW 42.17A.700 by failing to file the F-1 report by April 15, 2016.

ORDER

ON the basis of the foregoing Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law,

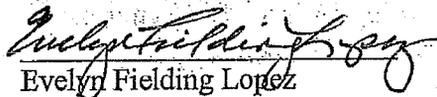
**IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the Respondent is assessed a civil penalty of \$1,000, in accordance with the F-1 penalty schedule set forth in WAC 390-37-160, for a filer with two prior PDC violation in the last five years, payable within 30 days of the date of the Order.**

In the event the Respondent fails to pay the \$1,000 penalty within 30 days of the date of the Order, PDC staff is directed to refer the matter to DES for collection of the amount owed.

This is an **Initial Order** of the Public Disclosure Commission.

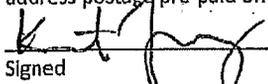

## Respondent's Appeal Rights

### **REVIEW OF INITIAL ORDER - BY THE COMMISSION**

The presiding officer will issue an initial order following a brief enforcement hearing. Any party may request the Commission **review** an initial order. Parties seeking the review must:

- Make the request orally or in writing, stating the reason for review (*WAC 390-37-144*).
- Deliver the request so it is received at the Commission office within **TWENTY-ONE (21) BUSINESS DAYS** after the postmark date of the initial order.

A Respondent does not need to pay a penalty until after the Commission rules on the request. If the Commission is unable to schedule a meeting to consider the request within twenty (20) business days, the initial order becomes a **final order** and the request will automatically be treated as a **request for reconsideration** of a final order (unless the party advises the Commission otherwise, such as by withdrawing the request). See more information on reconsideration below.

If the request for review was an oral request, it must now be confirmed in writing. The matter will be scheduled before the full Commission as soon as practicable. If the Commission does not receive a request for review within twenty-one (21) business days, the initial order will automatically become a **final order**. At that point, the Respondent is legally obligated to pay the penalty unless reconsideration has been sought or the matter has been timely appealed to Superior Court. *RCW 42.17A.755; RCW 34.05.470; RCW 34.05.570*.

### **RECONSIDERATION OF FINAL ORDER - BY THE COMMISSION**

Any party may ask the Commission to **reconsider** a final order. Parties seeking reconsideration must:

- Make the request in writing;
- Include the specific grounds or reasons for the request; and
- Deliver the request to the PDC office so it is received within **TWENTY-ONE (21) BUSINESS DAYS** of the date that the Commission serves this order upon the party. *WAC 390-37-150*.
- Note: the date of service by the Commission on a party is considered the date of mailing by U.S. mail if the order is mailed, the date the Order is emailed if agreed to by the Respondent, or the date received if the order is personally served. *RCW 34.05.010(19)*. (The Commission orders are generally mailed via U.S. mail or emailed.)

Finding, Conclusions & Order

Peter Swant

PDC Case 10086

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Within twenty (20) business days after the petition for reconsideration is filed, the Commission may either act on the petition or notify the parties in writing of the date by which it will act. If neither of these events happens within twenty business days, the Commission is deemed to have denied the petition for reconsideration. WAC 390-37-150.

A Respondent is not required to ask the Commission to reconsider a final order before seeking judicial review by a superior court. RCW 34.05.470(5).

**FURTHER APPEAL RIGHTS – SUPERIOR COURT**

A **final order** issued by the Public Disclosure Commission is subject to **judicial review** under the Administrative Procedure Act (APA), chapter 34.05 RCW. *RCW 42.17A.755*. The procedures are provided in the APA at RCW 34.05.510 - .574.

**ENFORCEMENT OF FINAL ORDERS**

If **enforcement** of a final order is required, the Commission may seek to enforce a final order in superior court under RCW 42.17A.755 - .760, and recover legal costs and attorney's fees if a penalty remains unpaid and no petition for judicial review has been filed. This action will be taken without further order by the Commission.
