Kurt,

Thank you for your reply. I immediately returned my missing F-1 report on December 7th. The reason my eligibility was under review on Skykomish School Board was due to many factors. I have worked at the school for four years as an assistant in the Pre-K room, while serving as a member of the board. Due to district policy, there is an income cap for employees being on the school board. While I was an assistant

with less hours per day and less pay per hour, I qualified. At the end of the 2015-1016 school year the lead teacher retired. The lead teacher, was paid through Northshore Family Services as part of an ECEAP program, however they partnered with the district to get an aid in the classroom as well as transportation. When she retired, I applied for the lead teacher job through Northshore and was hired. Then, a few weeks later I was notified by Puget Sound Educational District and Department of Early Learning that they were canceling our contract and they would no longer provide Skykomish with an ECEAP program. Quickly the Skykomish School District worked to find out how we were going to get the program back. Meanwhile, I was in waiting to hear from the ESD as we were in the appeal process of their decision. Due to lack of state wide funding and Skykomish School District not meeting the criteria for funding, our ECEAP program was finally lost. The district then took on the responsibility of funding the Pre-K program. I was hired on as the lead teacher, and we started up the program with full enrollment. While negotiating my contract, the business manager for Skykomish School, Christine Daniels, informed me that my income was going to be over the income cap to be eligible for school board. I agreed that I would write a letter of resignation to the board and resign at the next meeting. However, before the next meeting I was again informed that my income would be close but not always over the cap amount. I agreed that we would watch my income numbers for the next few months to make sure I qualify. That is where we stand now. This conflict started in June and has not completely been resolved. Waiting to see if I am income eligible to remain on the board. I believe the income cap is \$1,300 per month. So far, I have been under that amount, so I should be able to remain on the school board as I hope to do.
