I. INTRODUCTION

This matter was heard by the Washington State Public Disclosure Commission (Commission) on December 7, 2017 at the Public Disclosure Commission Office, 711 Capitol Way, Room 206, Olympia, Washington 98504. The hearing was held pursuant to RCW 34.05, RCW 42.17A, and WAC 390-37.

Commissioners present included Anne Levinson, Commission Chair (presiding); Jack Johnson, Commission Vice-Chair; and Commissioners John Bridges, Katrina Asay, and David Ammons. Also present were Assistant Attorney General Scott Douglas representing the Commission; Kurt Young, Compliance Officer on behalf of PDC Staff; and Assistant Attorney General Chad Standifer on behalf of PDC Staff. Respondent House Republican Organizational Committee (HROC) was represented by attorney Mark Lamb. The proceeding was open to the public and recorded.

The hearing concerned allegations that Respondent HROC violated RCW 42.17A.235 and .240 by failing to timely disclose \$85,000 in monetary contributions made to seven 2016

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II. STIPULATION

The parties jointly submitted a signed Stipulation as to Facts, Violations, and Penalty (Stipulation). Mr. Standifer summarized the Stipulation and asked the Commission to accept the Stipulation. Mr. Lamb likewise asked the Commission to accept the Stipulation. Mr. Young provided testimony regarding related compliance issues with HROC's C-4 reports filed in 2017. Mr. Young testified that HROC inadvertently carried forward the contribution and expenditure totals for the 2016 election which resulted in HROC overstating its beginning balance on the C-4 report filed in January 2017. That overstated balance was carried through on all subsequent C-4 reports filed by HROC. HROC agreed that all C-4 reports for 2017 would be amended prior to filing the Post-Election Report due on December 11, 2017. Staff testified that HROC was otherwise in compliance with RCW 42.17A and WAC 390 as of the date of the hearing.

The Commission voted 5-0 to accept the Stipulation as to Facts, Violations, and Penalty.

III. FINDINGS OF FACT

- 1. The House Republican Organizational Committee (HROC) supports Republican legislative candidates seeking the office of State Representative. HROC has been registered and reporting with the PDC dating back to at least 1994, and prior to that, HROC filed reports as the House Republican PAC.
- 2. On July 10, 2012, HROC filed an amended Committee Registration (C-l pc report) with the PDC as a continuing committee listing Arny Davis as COO-CFO, and Samantha Colton as Treasurer. The amended C-1 pc report filed by HROC was in effect throughout the 2016 election cycle, and the first six months of 2017.
- 3. On September 12, 2016, HROC timely filed the 2016 Post-Primary Election C-4 report covering the period of July 26 through August 31, 2016, disclosing \$943,000 in monetary contributions received and \$25,551 in expenditures made. The C-4 report disclosed two expenditures to ADP for HROC Payroll, fees and taxes totaling \$25,126.
 - 4. The C-4 report disclosed that no contributions were made by HROC to any candidates,

or bona fide political party organization during the reporting period covered by the 2016 Post-Primary Election C-4 report .

- 5. On September 25, 2017, HROC filed an amended Post-Primary Election C-4 report disclosing eight new expenditures in the form of monetary contributions totaling \$85,000 that were disclosed 378 days late, and more than 10 months after the November 8, 2016 general election had been held.
- 6. The late-reported HROC expenditures included a \$50,000 monetary contribution made to the Washington State Republican Party Non-Exempt funds account on August 30, 2016. In addition, the C-4 report disclosed seven previously unreported monetary contributions totaling \$35,000, \$5,000 each to the following 2016 Legislative candidates seeking the office of State Representative: Phil Fortunato; Teri Hickel; Janice Huxford; Linda Kochmar; Vicki Kraft; Jim Walsh; and Jesse Young.
- 7. HROC carried forward the contribution and expenditure totals for the 2016 election which resulted in HROC overstating its beginning balance on the C-4 report filed in January 2017. That overstated balance was carried through on all subsequent C-4 reports filed by HROC.
- 8. HROC was otherwise in compliance with RCW 42.17A and WAC 390 as of the date of the hearing in this matter.

IV. CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

- 1. The Commission has jurisdiction over this proceeding pursuant to RCW 42.17A, the State campaign finance and disclosure law; RCW 34.05, the Administrative Procedure Act; and WAC 390.
- 2. Respondent House Republican Organizational Committee violated RCW 42.17A.235 and 42.17A.240 by failing to timely disclose \$85,000 in monetary contributions made to seven 2016 candidates for State Representative, and one bona-fide political party organization on C-4 reports.

1	V. ORDER
2	Based upon the stipulated Findings and Conclusions, the Commission accepts the stipulation of
3	the parties and orders that:
4	1. Respondent House Republican Organizational Committee shall amend its 2017 C-4
5	reports to accurately reflect the assets and expenditures of HROC.
6	2. Respondent House Republican Organizational Committee is assessed a total civil
7	penalty of \$10,000 for violation of RCW 42.17A.235 and 42.17A.240, to be paid within 30
8	days of entry of this Order.
