Re: US Environmental Protection Agency Response to PDC Amended Complaint, Case No. 8321

Dear Ms. Lopez:

I am writing to respond to the above Amended Complaint filed by James Tupper on behalf of Save Family Farming (SFF) against Larry Wasserman, Strategies 360, Inc., and Dennis McLerran EPA Regional Administrator. Mr. Tupper's amended complaint provides neither factual nor legal basis for his PDC complaint against Mr. McLerran. The PDC complaint against Mr. McLerran should be dismissed.

It is clear from Mr. McLerran's declaration, provided to the PDC and the Washington State Attorney General's Office, and from other records submitted in this case that Mr. McLerran was acting in his official capacity as EPA Regional Administrator during the activities which are the subject of the SFF complaint.

None of Mr. Tupper's submissions on behalf of the SFF contradict this fundamental point.

As previously stated by EPA, the PDC lacks jurisdiction over Mr. McLerran's actions in his official capacity. In addition, the record demonstrates that Mr. McLerran's activities are not grassroots lobbying efforts.

The Washington State Public Disclosure Commission (PDC) has no jurisdiction over Mr. McLerran's official actions as Regional Administrator of U.S. EPA Region 10. The SFF complaint, and the amended complaint lack legal and factual foundation. EPA once again requests that the PDC complaint and the amended complaint against Mr. McLerran be dismissed.
