Dear Ms. Kersul:

The Public Disclosure Commission (PDC) has completed its initial review of the complaint you filed on September 15, 2016. Your complaint alleged that Working Families may have violated RCW 42.17A.305 by failing to submit an electioneering communications C6 report within the 24-hour deadline.

PDC staff reviewed your allegations, and as a result of staff's initial review, we found the following:


- When made aware of the complaint Working Families realized there had been a miscommunication and the media buy occurred earlier than anticipated.
- They filed the late C6 on September 15, 2016.
- Working Families has no previous violations of PDC laws and rules.

Based on these initial findings, I have determined failure to one C6 report within 24 hours does not amount to a material violation warranting further investigation. Pursuant to WAC 390-37-060(1)(b), Working Families will receive a warning letter, and a reminder to report all expenses in accordance with PDC laws and rules.

The PDC has closed the matter, and will not be conducting a more formal investigation into your complaint or pursuing further enforcement action in this case.
