Dear Mr. Carrier:

The Public Disclosure Commission (PDC) has completed its initial review of the complaint you filed on July 19, 2016. Your complaint alleged that Move Clark County Forward (MCCF) may have violated RCW 42.17A.320 by failing to include party preference on a mail piece.


PDC staff reviewed your allegations, and as a result of staff's initial review, we found the following:

- The mail piece sponsored by MCCF does not contain party preference as required by PDC laws and rules.
- When notified of the complaint MCCF amended their online advertising to include party preference.
- Move Clark County Forward has no previous violations of PDC laws and rules.

Based on these initial findings, I have determined MCCF failure to include party preference on one mailer and subsequent action to fix their advertising does not amount to a material violation warranting further investigation. Pursuant to WAC 390-37-060(1)(b), MCCF will receive a warning letter, and a reminder to include party preference on future advertising in accordance with PDC laws and rules. The PDC has closed the matter, and will not be conducting a more formal investigation into your complaint.
