While the activity is the same, I believe Ms. Malcom is further motivated by the fact her daughter also is employed by the District and will lose her job if this Proposition does not pass.

What impact does the alleged violation(s) have on the public?

Ms. Malcom, Office Manager for Kittitas County Fire District #7, is utilizing the resources of the District (Office) to campaign to support a yes vote on Proposition 1 in the upcoming election. Specifically, by communicating with potential voters, soliciting their support, she is doing so from her District Office, during her work hours, implying that the District is in support of a yes vote. Therefore, unduly influencing the public to vote yes, and provide their support in other campaign materials.
