What impact does the alleged violation(s) have on the public?

Chris Vance has been a paid lobbyist for the King County Corrections Guild since 2007. He has consistently advocated for the Guild in Olympia, while working for the State Superintendent of Public Education and most recently as a paid employee of King County Auditor's Office. He has received \$5,000 per month in compensation. He has consistently failed to register as a lobbyist both with the County and with the State. I have personally paid him to lobby for a bill I was working on. I paid him \$500.00 and he failed to both register and report that payment.

Most recently, he gave testimony to the Attorney General and to the PDC (sworn) and provided false information with regard to information he claimed he provided to Guild Officials about my attendance at political events. He indicated that Pete VonReichbauer had established a PAC which allowed the Guild to exceed normal campaign contribution limits. I therefore purchased 10 tickets to an event for VonReichbauer which was later reported as a personal contribution by myself and my wife of \$1,650.00 each. I later learned that Mr. VonReichbauer did not have a PAC that year. That resulted in me being sued by the AG for violations of RCW 42.17A which has been settled. I am accusing Mr. Vance of lying to the PDC and lying to the AG as well as his own personal violations of RCW 42.17A et.seq. I would like this investigated immediately. If not, I will file a 45-day Demand letter with the AG.

Vance also failed to report major independant expenditures that he made on behalf of the Guild to Pam Roach and Jane Hauge, all of which were approximately \$5,000.00. He receives a budget of approximately \$20-25K each year from the Guild to perform political action.

1. Would like to thank the Negotiations Team for all of their efforts. This would include time spent on days off.
2. Labor Management Item: Mandatory Overtime (3rd shift specifically).

Vice President's Report

1. Due to the vacancies created by the transfer of Dean Owens to training and the resignation of Brad Fowler, both the 2nd shift rep positions were vacated. Following the Article 3 section 2 of the Bylaws:

It will also establish a visible pattern for which NOI's, Witness NOI's, Written Verbal Counseling, LOCC's, Written Reprimand's, etc. It will also give the Guild a perspective of what issues confront our members. This is a large data base.
3. Issues with calculating time accrued and usable for Annual Vacation bidding have come up. I am currently evaluating a program that will make this process easier and straight forward. It looks to include your hire date, leave accrual (with auto adjustments for contract language), holiday earnings and maximum carry overs to just name a few. Hopefully a program like this will take all the guess work out and provide a predictable and consistent tool to assist not only the membership, but also the Admin Sgt.

We are in receipt of your complaint regarding Chris Vance (the "Respondent") but find that additional information is needed:

- 1) You indicated that you attached a Guild board member's declaration stating that the Respondent has been a lobbyist since 2007. However, the January 11, 2017 *King County Corrections Guild General Membership/Executive Board Meeting Minutes* that you attached do not appear to contain a declaration regarding the Respondent. The only reference to Chris Vance appears to be in the Attendance section, which lists him as the Guild's political advisor. Please kindly provide the referenced declaration or indicate where we might obtain this information. **I thought I had included all the attachments. I've included what was to have been attached to the original complaint. I have also attached 2 additional Declarations that support Vance's status and will be used to support my claim that he provided false, misleading information to the AG Investigator and actually perjured himself before the Commission with the PDC's Investigator who put Vance under oath**
- 2) You referenced the Respondent's 2015 L-1 report in your complaint but attached his L-3 report, which does not request information regarding lobbying on behalf of an organization's members (that information is contained in the L-1). Please kindly confirm which lobbyist report you wish us to review or attach the referenced L-1 report.
- 3) The statute of limitations for PDC violations is five years. As a result, we are unable to address your allegation regarding the earnings reported on the Respondent's L-2 report for 2008.

If you have any questions, please reply to this email.

Finally, I comment to you the PDC Investigative File 17-056 PC which contains numerous references to Vance. I previously

submitted Vance's registration for Lobbyist wherein he perjured himself by OMITTING the fact that he was on retainer, and continues to be on retainer with the Guild (a labor organization that allots \$25K a year budget to Vance to lobby local politicians and State Officials. Only after he co-operated with the AG's investigation, did he re-register. When he was working for the Superintendent of Public Instruction 1/2 time, he would lobby the legislature while he was on the payroll of the State of Washington.

4. I first became involved in the King County Corrections Guild (the "Guild") back in 1998 when I was elected Vice President of the Guild. I served as the Guild's Vice President until 2005.
5. In 2005, I became the Guild President where I served until I was promoted to Captain in July of 2013. Vice President Randy Weaver was appointed to fill my term.
6. From 1998 to 2013, I recognized Karstetter as the Guild's Legal Advisor and believed and considered Karstetter to be the Guild's employee.
7. The Guild hired Chris Vance as a political consultant in 2007. Vance's role was to handle certain public relations issues and political action for the Guild. One of his responsibilities was to provide recommendations as to which political candidate or elected official could further the Guild's interests.
8. The Guild was required to allow its general membership to approve any endorsements of political candidates. An endorsement allowed that candidate to use the name of the Guild in the candidate's campaign. An endorsement, with the exception of judges, would likely also include a donation of money for the candidate's campaign. The membership was allowed to vote on donations, but a vote was not required.
9. Karstetter or Vance were responsible for getting donations to the candidate. Most often donations were made by Guild check, but sometimes the donation would be made by attending an event hosted by the candidate. As Guild president, I often directed Karstetter to attend such events, as a full-time employee of the Guild and on the Guild's

behalf. Vice President Randy Weaver would often attend events with Karstetter to provide a further Guild presence. Chris Vance would rarely, if ever, attend such events as he also worked in Olympia a number of days a week or would be tied up in the evening.

10. These events included Dow Constantine's annual birthday celebration in October or November each year, Bob Ferguson's kick-off breakfast and annual shrimp feed, Pete VonReichbauer's annual Emerald Downs event, and Rod Dembowski's annual chili feed, among others. I approved Karstetter's attendance at all such events, as a representative of the Guild.
11. I would often authorize Karstetter to attend such an event on behalf of the Guild, and then submit a receipt for reimbursement, which is consistent with the Guild's bylaws because Karstetter did not have a Guild credit card. This reimbursement process was a matter of convenience for the Guild.
12. Annually, a budget was approved for the Guild's political agenda and public relations. It generally was in an amount of \$20,000.00 to \$25,000.00 per year. Expenses that were incurred by the Guild attending political events throughout the year would come out of that budget. These expenses did not require individual approval, although an official Guild endorsement of a candidate required a vote of the membership.
13. The Guild's executive board was aware of and approved the reimbursement process. Board members were aware of the events that I directed Karstetter to attend on behalf of the Guild, and were free to attend along with Karstetter or Weaver, which they sometimes did.
14. My instructions to Karstetter to pay for various events on behalf of the Guild and to then seek reimbursement were made in the presence of the Guild's executive board and in the presence of Chris Vance.
15. Chris Vance never raised any objections or concerns to me about the reimbursement process whereby Karstetter would pay for an event or otherwise make a donation on behalf of the Guild and then seek reimbursement. Since Vance was instructed to take direction, outside of a Guild board meeting, only from the Guild president, any such objections or concerns would necessarily have been made to me.
16. I never heard or observed Chris Vance raise any objections or concerns to Karstetter, to the Guild's board members, or to any other person about the reimbursement process. Based on my 15 years as either vice president or president of the Guild, I believe that any statement by Vance to the effect that he raised any such objections and concerns to

me, to Karstetter, or to the Guild, is erroneous. Any such objections or concerns would have been reported to me, but they were not.

17. If such objections or concerns had been reported to me, by Chris Vance or anyone else, I would have either provided Karstetter with a Guild credit card to use in making Guild contributions, or instructed the Guild treasurer to write a check in advance. The reimbursement process was done solely for the Guild's convenience.
18. I have been informed that the Guild has alleged that two signatures would have been required for reimbursement checks made out to Karstetter. That is not true because approximately ten years ago, the Guild's bank no longer required two signatures, and the Guild began using checks with only one signature line.
19. Every quarter, the Guild's Trustees reviewed every expenditure and notify the membership that the expenditures were authorized and accounted for. If there was any concern on their part, the Trustees would have reported that concern to the full board.
20. During my tenure with the Guild, politicians and elected officials were told to communicate generally with Vance or Karstetter as the Guild's representatives. At no time did I hear from any politician or elected official that he or she had a concern with the Guild's reimbursement process. Many times, I received a thank-you note addressed to the Guild and thanking the Guild for attending an event that Karstetter had attended on behalf of the Guild.
21. I am aware of the 45-day demand sent on September 6, 2016 by the Guild's attorney to the Attorney General's office. I am also aware of the litigation filed against Karstetter by the Attorney General's office. In my opinion, and based on my 15 years in Guild leadership, the Guild's 45-day demand letter was ignorant of the facts and lacks merit. No one from the Guild contacted me to discuss or verify any of the allegations in the letter, despite the fact that its allegations related to times that I was either the vice president or president of the Guild.

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
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22. If the Guild had contacted me, I would have explained that the reimbursement process alleged in the demand letter was done with the awareness and approval of both the Guild and Chris Vance. Moreover, I would have explained that the contributions ascribed to Karstetter were in fact Guild contributions, and would have been understood by all parties involved—by me, by Karstetter, by the candidates in question, by Chris Vance, and by the Guild's executive board—as Guild contributions.

DECLARATION OF MATTHEW OWENS

I, Matthew Owens, whose signature appears below, do hereby declare, under penalty of perjury of the law of the State of Washington, that the following is true and accurate:

1. I am over the age of 18. I am competent to execute this Declaration. I base this Declaration on personal knowledge of the facts contained herein.
2. I have known Jared C. Karstetter, Jr. since 1990.
3. I was on the Board of Trustees for the King County Corrections Guild (the "Guild") from January of 2013 through February of 2014.
4. I was subsequently elected to Vice President of the Guild in February of 2014, and served in that position until a special election which was certified in June of 2016.
5. During my time as a Trustee, each quarter, I and Vergel Bautistia were responsible to review all expenditures of the Guild to verify that they were appropriate.
6. During my tenure with the Guild, I was aware of a process whereby Guild employee Jared Karstetter would attend various political events on behalf of the Guild at the request of the Board or the President, and would pay for the event with his personal credit card. Karstetter would submit a receipt for the expense, and the Guild would issue him a reimbursement check containing the Guild Treasurer's signature. The requirement of 2 signatures was eliminated years earlier due to the bank no longer needing 2 signatures and the Guild checks only had a line for 1 signature.
7. During my tenure as Trustee, all reimbursements to Karstetter were deemed appropriate and approved.
8. When I assumed the Vice President position, my role with the Guild changed. I served as backup for the president, presiding over the Guild in his absence. I also was responsible to attend all meetings that the Guild was involved in, and to assist the Treasurer if needed.
9. The Guild employed a political advisor, Chris Vance. At no time during my tenure as Trustee or Vice President did Chris Vance ever express in my presence any concern regarding the reimbursement process whereby Karstetter would attend political events


- on the Guild's behalf. To the contrary, when I specifically asked Vance on repeated occasions to confirm that the reimbursement process was proper, he responded that the process was not a problem so long as the Guild was not exceeding contribution limits.
10. I also attended some of the candidates' political events with Karstetter on behalf of the Guild. For example, in late 2015, I attended with Karstetter the Dow Constantine Annual 39th Birthday Party that the Guild regularly sponsored. Randy Weaver and his wife Sonja Weaver attended also, as they had done previously, but stayed for only a few minutes.
 11. I never observed Karstetter do anything that would have cast any doubt on the fact that he was attending in his capacity as a representative of the Guild and on the Guild's behalf. At the Dow Constantine event that I attended, the King County Corrections Guild was prominently recognized as one of the sponsors of the event. I also attended an annual Emerald Downs event for Pete VonReichbauer, along with other board members including the Weavers. The Guild's presence at this event was also paid for by Karstetter and subsequently reimbursed. I observed Karstetter ask Pete VonReichbauer whom he needed to give his credit card to in order to pay for our table, which was assigned and labeled as the "KING COUNTY CORRECTIONS GUILD."
 12. I do not believe that there would have been any confusion as to the source of any Guild contributions that were made by Karstetter and then reimbursed. I never observed Karstetter do anything or represent anything other than that the contributions were Guild contributions.
 13. In my capacity as Guild vice president, I have also attended numerous meetings with the Executive and King County Council Members. Without exception, they recognized Karstetter as a Guild employee and would often thank the Guild (not Karstetter) for its financial support for events when Karstetter had represented the Guild and then been reimbursed by the Guild.
 14. Based on my position with the Guild and my interactions with the various people involved, I believe that Vance and others at the Guild, including Randy Weaver, harbor personal animus toward Karstetter.
 15. I believe that this animus arises from events beginning in October, 2015. At that time the Guild president was on an extended vacation, so I was the acting president. During a Guild board meeting, the Treasurer proposed that the Guild switch from paying Vance \$5,000 per month, to paying him on an hourly basis. This was because Vance was at the time directing most if not all of his energies toward campaigning for election to the United

States Senate. Karstetter, as the Guild's employee and legal advisor, was assigned to draft a motion changing Vance's status to hourly, which was then unanimously adopted by the Guild executive board.

16. Vance was upset about the change. When the Guild president returned, Vance threatened to withdraw from the Senate race and to notify the Washington State Republican Chair that he had been forced to do so because of the Guild's change in his status. Vance threatened that this would cause the Guild to face problems in Olympia in the future. The executive board then reversed themselves and reinstated Vance's salary of \$5,000 per month.
17. I believe that the Guild president and Vance thought Karstetter had deliberately caused the change in Vance's status. But in fact, Karstetter had merely drafted the motion that was presented to the executive board, a task he was commonly assigned as the Guild's legal advisor and employee.
18. Next, beginning in January of 2016, there was some internal upheaval at the Guild arising from allegations directed by then-president Randy Weaver against the Guild treasurer. The treasurer was ultimately relieved of his duties and I was appointed interim treasurer.
19. I was tasked with reviewing the Guild's accounts for a number of years prior and creating a spreadsheet for the Guild's board. I found no cause for concern connected to the Guild's political contributions or associated reimbursements to Karstetter.
20. Near the end of January, 2016, Weaver presented me a check for amounts he said he owed the Guild for parking reimbursements. It was learned that a whistleblower complaint had alleged that Weaver had sought reimbursements for parking that had already been paid by the Guild. Weaver and his wife Sonja Weaver, who is also a corrections officer, were investigated by the Jail's internal investigations unit relative to these allegations.
21. In connection with the investigation of the Weavers, I directed Karstetter to provide the King County Ombudsman's office confirmation that certain credit card receipts provided by the Weavers for reimbursements were from a Guild credit card. The Ombudsman's office had informed Karstetter that they needed this information in connection with the investigation and were formally requesting it. I accordingly directed Karstetter to provide it. I was directing Karstetter in my capacity as Guild vice president because the investigation was of the president, Weaver.

22. I believe that Weaver and others at the Guild thought Karstetter had deliberately sought to undermine Weaver, even though Karstetter had acted at my direction as he was required to do as a Guild employee. Weaver terminated Karstetter's employment on April 27, 2016.
23. A short time after Karstetter's termination, I was present at a Guild membership meeting where Vance was asked whether the reimbursement process whereby Karstetter was reimbursed for Guild contributions was a problem. Vance stated that any violation was not criminal and would amount to no more than a "slap on the wrist," if anything. This was the first time Vance ever made any comments about the Guild's reimbursement practice with respect to Karstetter.
24. I am aware that the Guild's attorney sent to the Attorney General's office a demand letter alleging that Karstetter intentionally violated Washington's campaign finance laws. It is my personal belief that this letter arose from unwarranted personal animus based on the events described above, as well as being inaccurate on the facts.

Interview conducted by Tony Perkins

Doug Justus stated that he was the KCCG Vice President from 1998 – 2005, and the President from 2005 – June 27, 2013, at which point he was promoted to Captain and left the bargaining unit and the KCCG board.

Mr. Justus stated that during his time on the KCCG board, political contributions were approved in one of two ways:

1. With input from Chris Vance about candidate endorsements and contributions, the exec. board would consider a motion. If the motion was approved, a contribution was made.
2. The board maintained a fund of \$20,000 per year for contributions to elected officials made at lunches, dinners and other events (e.g candidate shrimp feed or racetrack event). The board asked Chris Vance to attend the events, and if he did not wish to go, Jared Karstetter would attend in his place. Mr. Justus said that Karstetter would check with Vance about contribution limits, to make sure that the Guild wouldn't exceed its limit to a campaign.

Mr. Justus stated that all of the contributions described above were approved through a formal board motion.

Mr. Justus stated that Karstetter requested and received reimbursement from the Guild treasurer for contributions he made with personal funds. He was not certain of the frequency of reimbursement versus "pre-imburement" before the fact of the contribution. He believed that Mr. Karstetter identified himself as a Guild representative at campaign events. He stated that the practice of reimbursing Karstetter for contributions was approved by the KCCG board, and discussed openly at board meetings. Mr. Justus clarified that his personal knowledge of the board's approval was limited to periods before June 27, 2013.

Mr. Justus did not recall conversations with Chris Vance in which Vance expressed any concerns about the legality of reimbursing Karstetter for contributions.

Mr. Justus stated that the Guild switched its accounts to Bank of America in approximately 2005. He did not recall the institution that held the Guild's accounts before that time. He believed that before switching to Bank of America, the Guild's checks had two signature lines. With the switch to Bank of America, the Guild ordered new checks with a single signature line.

Interview conducted by Tony Perkins

1. I've listened to your testimony to PDC staff, in which you said that you expressed concerns on multiple occasions to KCCG leadership about the practice of Jared Karstetter or others being reimbursed for campaign contributions made with personal funds. You said that you expressed these concerns to Randy Weaver, and possibly to Doug Justus.

Do you believe these conversations happened at board meetings, or in one-on-one conversations?

CV: Both. At an open board meeting at least once. He also spoke individually to Weaver, and possibly Doug Justus. He also remembered discussing the practice with board members via text message.

2. If at a meeting, was Jared Karstetter present at those meetings?

CV: Yes.

3. Was Mike Music present?

CV: He didn't recall specifically, but he believed he would have been. He said it would be unusual for the treasurer to be absent from a meeting.

4. Did you also convey your concerns to Karstetter individually? To Music?

CV: Not to Music. But he recalled speaking to Karstetter, and also exchanging text messages with him about the reimbursement practice. Mr. Vance said he doesn't still have access to those text messages.

5. Karstetter has described a "Public Affairs/Political Action" line item within the KCCG budget, which he said was funded to the tune of 20 – 25 K /year.

It is correct that KCCG has such a pool of funds? What is it used for?

CV: The KCCG fiscal / budgetary process is haphazard, ad hoc, incredibly informal. Budget presentations typically consisted of the treasurer with a whiteboard at meetings, showing the balance in various accounts. No cash in-cash out information, no planning for anticipated expenses. In some years the board identified a specific public affairs/political action line item, but it didn't happen every year. And he did not recall the board actually voting on any budget.

When the line item was provided for, it was to be used for contributions and IEs.

6. IEs? Does KCCG conduct IEs? (\$1,940 in calls for Reagan Dunn in 2013, no reporting otherwise.)

CV: The guild had conducted IEs 3 – 5 times, in his recollection.

7. Is the pool of funds used for contributions?

CV: Yes.

8. Who authorizes these contributions?

CV: The KCCB board meets twice monthly, first in a board meeting, and then in a meeting of the general membership and the board. (It's not unusual for the general membership meeting to consist of the board and a few extra members.) He said that candidate endorsements can only happen at the second meeting the general membership meeting, but that contributions could be authorized at either meeting. He said that contributions could also be authorized by the board in an email discussion between meetings.

9. Who carries out the contributions?

CV: Following the endorsement and authorization process described above, most of the time the treasurer would cut a check for Mr. Vance, he would take it home to find a candidate's address, and then would mail the contribution. Sometimes the treasurer would mail the contribution. On rare occasions, Karstetter or the board president would take the check to the candidate, for example at a campaign event.

10. Karstetter states that contributions made from the "Public Affairs/Political Action" budget didn't need to be formally approved by the KCCG board. Is that correct?

CV: "All contributions are authorized by a formal action of the board," as described above. Mr. Vance said it appeared obvious to him now that Karstetter had been stepping outside the normal process to obtain reimbursement for contributions made with his personal funds. He said that the open-air process for authorizing and making contributions was as he described. He said that it was the subject of "numerous robust discussions" at board meetings. He said it was possible that the KCCG board and legal Counsel (Karstetter) could have agreed on a different process in executive session, or in communications outside meetings, but that if they did, it ran completely counter to the information they shared with him, their lobbyist, and the consultant who made campaign recommendations to them. Mr. Vance believes this is unlikely.

11. Karstetter states that you recommended the use of the "Public Affairs/Political Action" budget for contributions. Correct?

CV: I bring the board a list of recommended of candidates to support. Beyond that, he was unaware of any particular pool of funds being used to make contributions.

12. Did you ever witness Karstetter seeking reimbursement or being reimbursed for contributions at a KCCG board meeting?

CV: No.

13. In speaking with Karstetter, he described an annual fundraiser for Dow Constantine as a PAC fundraiser, not connected to Dow's campaign. Dow Constantine doesn't have a separate PAC that is registered with the PDC to raise and spend contributions. All contributions Dow reports to the PDC got to his executive campaign, and are subject to limit.

Karstetter described himself as naive about campaign finance and related processes, and said that it was for that reason you were brought on board with KCCG. Do you agree with his self-assessment of political naiveté?

CV: Karstetter was KCCG's "political guy" for 20 years, going back to the time when Mr. Vance was on the King County Council, the person to talk to for guidance on making candidate contributions. He said

that Karstetter knows less than he (Mr. Vance) does, but far more than the average citizen. Mr. Vance stated Karstetter was at least aware of the difference between a candidate's authorized committee and a separate PAC, based on discussions they'd had about Pete Von Reichbauer's committees. But Mr. Vance couldn't say whether Karstetter was aware that Dow Constantine doesn't have a PAC separate from his campaign.

14. Did Karstetter ever tell you that he was making a contribution to a candidate on behalf of KCCG, so that the Guild could avoid exceeding limits with other contributions it might make? Do you recall specifics?

CV: I can't recall any such discussions with Karstetter.

15. Did you deliver the KCCG \$1,800 contribution to Pete Von Reichbauer made in March of 2013? Do you recall meeting with PVR in 2013?

CV: He typically mailed checks. He doesn't have records or an independent recollection concerning how the KCCG's contribution was transmitted to Pete Von Reichbauer in March of 2013.

Mr. Karstetter provided a copy of a Dow Constantine fundraising invitation that was addressed to the Guild and had been sent to him at his personal residence, as one piece of evidence. He stated that “the Guild – who specifically directed and approved everything it now purports to complain about – is the party who gains” in this matter.

Mr. Karstetter stated that he believes the Guild’s allegations were “made in bad faith in an effort to gain some perceived advantage in my separate lawsuit against the Guild for breaching my employment contract.” He stated that the Guild’s allegations against him do not make any sense since he does not live in King County and he has nothing to gain personally by “paying for King County Elected officials events.”

Mr. Karstetter stated that “in light of the pending breach of contract case between me and the Guild, I respectfully submit that this matter should be summarily dismissed.”

2. Chris Vance

On October 11, 2016, Staff conducted an investigative telephone interview under oath with Chris Vance. Mr. Vance is a former King County Councilmember from 1993 through 2001, and a State Representative from the 31st Legislative District from 1990 through 1993. Mr. Vance also served as the Chair of the Washington State Republican Party, and is currently running for U.S. Senate.

Mr. Vance was hired by the Guild in 2007, and has worked for the Guild ever since. His duties include acting as a Lobbyist for the Guild and providing testimony before the King County Council, the King County Executive, and the Washington State Legislature. Mr. Vance has been registered as a lobbyist with the PDC since 2014, filing Monthly Lobbyist Expense reports. Mr. Vance also provides external press relations for the Guild, and oversees the Guilds candidate endorsement and contribution recommendations.

Mr. Vance stated that he has a number of other clients that he provides public affairs and political consulting services to, and that the Guild is not his sole client. He stated that he attends two Guild meetings a month and has done so since 2007, which includes a Board meeting of elected Guild representatives, and a general membership meeting. He stated the Guild has a small office in Tukwila, but it is not staffed and the Officers and Officer Representatives serve as an “ad-hoc” organization. He stated that the monthly Board meetings include discussions about county budgets for corrections officers, collective bargaining and union issues, legislation before the Washington State Legislature or King County government, endorsing candidates and making political contributions.

Mr. Vance stated that. The Guild endorses candidates and he is involved in every step of the endorsement process including scheduling the candidate interviews, developing the candidate interview questionnaires, presentations to the Guild Board and members, making endorsement recommendations, and then communicating those endorsements through press releases and the website. He stated that once the candidate endorsement process has been completed, he was involved in the next step of was making political contributions to candidates. This included him making presentations and recommendations at the monthly Guild Board and Guild general membership meetings concerning which candidates to support.

Mr. Vance stated that he has known Mr. Karstetter since the 1990's when he served on the King County Council. He stated that Mr. Karstetter would be present at the two monthly meetings he referenced earlier, and that he likely had other meetings with him over the years in which he was in attendance but he did not recall meeting with him one on one. He stated that Mr. Karstetter was in attendance at meetings in which they discussed the Guild endorsing candidates and making contributions to candidates.

Mr. Vance recalled several occasions in which Mr. Karstetter disagreed with his candidate recommendations and suggested the Guild endorse or contribute to a different candidate. He stated that Mr. Karstetter's role in making contributions from the Guild to candidates included attending the candidate fundraisers, and, in some instances, delivering the contributions made by the Guild to candidates. He stated that the Guild also made contributions to the caucus political committees, and he thought those contributions were mailed directly to those committees.

Mr. Vance stated that he informed Mr. Karstetter that it was a potential PDC issue for him to be reimbursed by the Guild for contributions he had made personally.

3. David Kirk

On October 17, 2016, Staff interviewed David Kirk, current Guild Treasurer, by telephone interview under oath.

Mr. Kirk has been a member of the King County Corrections Guild since August of 2000, and is currently the Guild's Treasurer since being elected in April of 2016. His Treasurer duties include being part of the Executive Board of the Guild, overseeing the day-to-day operations of the Guild, making sure all of the Guild's bills are timely paid, reviewing Guild investments, and balancing the Guild's various accounts.

Mr. Kirk stated that the Guild member's dues are administered by King County, and the Guild's 539 member's dues are payroll deducted from their checks and direct deposited from King County into the Guild checking account. He stated that the Guild has a small office in a renovated house located in Tukwila, and that the Officers basically run the Guild on an ad-hoc basis. He stated that the Guild has at least two meetings a month at their offices, a board meeting and a general membership meeting, and they conduct Executive Board training sessions at the office.

Mr. Kirk stated that he would work as Guild Treasurer wherever he finds a place to work, which included from the Office, from home, and other locations. He stated that he does not have an accounting or financial background, but that the Guild hired an accountant to train him on Guild business and the computer program.

Mr. Kirk stated that the Guild does endorse candidates for public office, and the Executive Board would conduct two to three candidate interviews during the monthly Board meetings. The candidates would appear before the Board and make a presentation that lasted between 15-30 minutes and included a question and answer section from Guild Officers.

In reviewing your allegations, we find that additional information is needed regarding the independent expenditure that you allege Chris Vance made to Pam Roach and Jan Hauge on behalf of King County Corrections Guild. Please kindly indicate **when** the expenditure occurred and what was purchased, if known. If political advertising was purchased, and you have a copy of the ad, please provide the image as well. **I'm attaching XLS reflecting IE's and a Vance Budget of \$25k. Hauge, Roach, Dunn. I believe only Hauges was reported. While the Roach and Dunn may appear to beyond your statute of limitations, I believe that Vance has exhibited a continued pattern of deception, failure to register and deceit including perjury. The IE's were all for phone banking in the respective Candidates' District**

On page 17 of your 60 page complaint, there is a printout from our Advanced Search page showing what appears to be independent expenditures for Jane Hague by various sponsors. However, neither the Guild nor Pam Roach are mentioned on the printout and it is unclear which part of your complaint is intended to support your allegation regarding the independent expenditure. Towards this end, any information you can provide is greatly appreciated. To respond, please reply to this email. **Again, as stated previously and above, Vance clearly was lobbying state officials and local government officials. He has done this since his hire back in 2007. Only recently has he registered, however, 2x each month, he appears before the King County Corrections Guild and gives an update of his lobbying efforts. The King County Corrections Guild maintains a web site that has EVERY set of minutes since it's inception in 1996. I recommend the Investigator subpoena those minutes and you will see a pattern in each and everyone of them depicting Vance as the Guilds Lobbyist. His most current Registration has him perjuring himself by failing to disclose the fact that he works for an organization of public employees and is essentially paid \$5,000 per month which is money coming FROM King County through the Guild as it's membership has automatic dues deductions in the form of a King County Check that is made payable to the Guild. He also perjured himself by checking NO in the box that asks if his "client" has a membership. There are 550 Deputies and Sergeants of the King County Jail and I've learned he has entered into a contract with the Juvenile Detention Employees of the Jails to do lobbying for them as well. The Guild can easily provide the Commission with an electronic file of every set of minutes and motions reflecting the activity of Vance**
