### File a Formal Complaint - Bret Uhrich

Respondent is sending out unsolicited text messages to people they believe are constituents in the legislative district. In this situation, I do not live in the legislative district but the information in the communication shows me that the campaign has acquired a list from someone other than a person voluntarily giving their contact information to the campaign. In this case, "Michael" is my father who lives in the legislative district but exclusively uses his middle name, "Doug," which shows the list was generated in a manner other than voluntarily providing his contact information to the campaign.

This communication constitutes a "mass communication" as defined by WAC 390-05-290 and "political advertising" under subsection (3) as it is used for the purpose of appealing, directly or indirectly, for votes or for financial or other support or opposition in any election campaign. Under RCW 42.17A.320(1), this communication must include sponsor's name and address and must clearly identify the candidate's preferred party. The latter two are missing.

In addition to these violations, unsolicited text messages are incredibly annoying.
