This complaint from Mr. Mundy was also addressed in complaint #42389.

Although this is the same complaint, I did note differences in the clothing I was allegedly wearing.

In this complaint, Mr. Mundy alleges that I was in a patrol uniform passing out campaign signs from my patrol vehicle. In complaint #42389 a copy of a newspaper letter to the editor was attached. In this he stated I was in my campaign shirt and leaning against my patrol vehicle.

My activities on this weekend were as follows.

Saturday the 28<sup>th</sup> the town of Lone begins to celebrate Down River Days. They have a parade followed by activities at the park. I was off duty on this date. I participated in the events and was wearing my campaign clothing (bright red shirt, bright red hat, tan pants, black shoes). I was driving my own personal vehicle (silver Dodge truck). I participated in the parade and had a booth at the park. I campaigned all day and into the evening. My patrol vehicle was parked at my residence – 50 miles away.

Sunday the 29<sup>th</sup>, the town continues with activities at the park. Although I had paid for a booth for both dates, I chose not to have a booth on Sunday to prevent any confusion regarding my activities.

On this date I was in my patrol uniform (tan shirt, no hat, green pants, black boots). I drove my marked patrol vehicle ("Champaign" colored Chevy SUV). I parked my vehicle in the city park in full view of hundreds of people. I spent the majority of my time walking around the park, in full view of hundreds of people. I did leave the park for a short time to answer a call for service and to get fuel. At no time did I have any campaign materials in or on my patrol vehicle. My campaign items were at my residence – 50 miles away.
