

## Complaint Description

### File a Formal Complaint - Alan McDowell

Below is evidence of a scan that took place in the treasurer's office after signature was provided by Spokane County Treasurer Rob Chase. Rob stated that he would take the document to the Republican County Platform Committee personally.

### What impact does the alleged violation(s) have on the public?

Rob Chase was acting incompetent in the Treasurer's Office at the time of the event. He should know the rules of not calling in private political business on a public property such as the treasurer's office.

To Election Commission:

I made a mistake on a resolution on an unknown date by having the document signed for the 2016 Republican precinct party platform in the Superior Court Building Treasurer's office. I believe the time stamp on the document is off. The only way to find an exact time is to subpoena old phone records from Verizon.

In the picture, notice the wood grain in the background. That scan was made on a backroom treasurer's office table. The table is forensic evidence of an illegal activity taking place.

Assistant Treasurer Mike Volz was an unknowing witness. He opened the door after the scanner was in my pocket and the document was in the possession of Spokane County Treasurer Rob Chase. Rob Chase stated in the phone call with me that he would sign the document and take it to the Republican Party Platform

Committee. He confirmed in the office before Mike Volz entered the office that he would take the document to the Republican Party for submission.

I was called into Rob's office to sign the document and did not know at the time I was doing anything wrong. I became suspicious after Mike Volz walked in the door and said "hi" in a sarcastic voice tone and I was on my way out the door.

I believe that it's important to submit the information because I'm questioning Rob Chase's competency to be a commissioner if he would make such a mistake in his previous office job. He is obviously under the legal oversight of oversight agencies at the state and federal level and should be competent enough to know that he was doing something wrong as an elected official.

The resolutions were one of two I lobbied in the Freeman School District and throughout North Spokane before the Spokane County Republican Convention.

Incident Report 10:49 AM

1. I was walking from the County Commissioner's office after dropping off a Letter to County Attorney Jim Kaufman's Office and dropping a quick letter to the secretary in the County Commissioner's office. The letter pertained to public corruption in the treasurer's office in 2016.
2. 2016, I was incompetent to understand private political party business vs. public property business at the time Rob Chase called me into his treasurer's office to sign the last signature on my Republican Party Resolutions.
3. I was laughing hysterically for the first time in months.
4. The laughing pertained to the incompetence of Spokane County Treasurer Rob Chase.
5. Chase previously signed my Republican Resolutions that ended in me creating a campaign at the Republican County Convention that contributed to shutting down all the Spokane County Resolutions and platforms until 2020. I believe the 2014 Resolutions are still adopted today 11/1/2018.
6. The Spokane County Prohibition on resolutions related to myself campaigning against Republican Representative Matt Shea to allow public debate on platform resolutions.
7. Spokane Police Department Strategic Initiatives Director Jacqui MacConnell walked North past me while I was walking south towards the Post Street Bridge Laughing hysterically without seeing her.
8. I believe she was walking away from city hall towards her office.
9. Jacqui caught me laughing at an odd moment.
10. I would not be laughing normally in her presence.
11. Jacqui said hello.
12. I said hello back when I saw her.

13. I continued walking South onto the Post Street Bridge.
14. Jacqui called my name.
15. I turned around to face her North.
16. I said hello.
17. Jacqui stated that she had provided the Procedural Justice Manual to the front desk months ago and didn't know why I hadn't received it.
18. I told her that I hadn't seen an email that she had provided me the manual.
19. I asked her if it was still there?
20. Jacqui stated that it probably was somewhere else by now and that she would have to go looking for it.
21. I said, "okay."
22. I turned and walked on.
23. I was in no way shape or form laughing about the current cases in Superior Court and City Court.
24. I'm upset that she caught me off guard laughing about something completely different.
25. I'm suspicious of her statement of placing the manual at the front desk months ago and don't remember getting a notice.
26. The last time we talked about the procedural justice manual was at the MLK event in the convention center while Lisa Brown was speaking.
27. At the time we spoke in January, she apologized for not getting the manual to me. She stated that she was still looking for it.

28. I never remember getting an email afterwards.
