Please use the power of your office to bring these issues to light, and to hold accountable anyone who has violated the spirt or the letter of the law in this situation. His campaign should immediately refund the county for the printing, preparation and mailing of this item.

Stretching Your County Tax Dollar

Every government and family in the United States is coping with the economic downtum. In Pierce County we limited the growth of government during the boom years and we set aside money in a "rainy day" account at the time we did not know that the proverbial rainy day was just a few years off. Even with this careful planning budget cuts were still necessary. Here is how we managed your county budget:

The Challenge: cope with a \$66 million dollar shortfall in the county budget, while preserving public services.

The total Pierce County budget, at its highest point, was \$880 million. Most of this spending is controlled by state and federal mandates. Just over 1/3 of that number makes up the "general fund" which pays for most of the programs that we think of as county government: sheriff's deputies, the prosecutor's office, general government, parks and other programs. Almost every cut in the county budget must be made to the general fund.

Set Priorities: Public Safety and No New Taxes

As a County Council we thought about the county budget the same way my family would think about its own budget. We set priorities, we decided what had to be protected from cuts and we decided what the county could do without for the duration of the downturn.

Our highest priority was public safety, which accounts for over 75% of the general fund. Unfortunately when you prioritize your largest budget area that means the remainder of the budget must take larger cuts. This allowed us to keep all of our deputy sheriffs on the street, while other counties face large layoffs.

Other local governments and the State of Washington have relied on tax increases to make their budgets work. We decided against this. Our view is that families are struggling to make ends meet, businesses are closing, jobs are being jost. We thought it more rational public policy for the county to tighten its beit, rather than pass more pain on to taxpayers.



Dear Mr. Stuzman:

I received your letter dated August 5, 2010.

In your letter, you state that you have enclosed a copy of a complaint received [by the PDC] on July 19, 2010, "alleging that [I] . . . may have violated RCW 42.17.130 by using Pierce County facilities to assist your campaign for State Representative." In fact, your letter contained no complaint received by the PDC on July 19, 2010 containing the allegation mentioned above. Your letter did contain a communication on a PDC complaint form that was received by the PDC on July 19, 2010, but that communication, from a Kristine M. Smith of Tacoma, did not contain the allegation you mention. I'll address this matter further below. You also included a copy of a complaint from Jeffrey Coats and Mr. Coats did allege the violation that you reference in connection with the Kristine Smith communication, so I will assume you intend for me to respond to the Coats complaint as far as responding to allegations of a violation of RCW 42.17.130 (for that is the only communication that makes such an allegation). If you have, perhaps, an actual document from Ms. Smith wherein she makes citation to or alleges the violation of RCW 42.17.130, Title 390 WAC or any other section of RCW 42.17 perhaps you can forward that communication to me for review.

Jeffrey Coats complaint Rec'd by PDC July 26, 2010


It is my understanding that Mr. Coats is an attorney practicing in the State of Washington and that he and his wife are political operatives working for my opponent Cathy Dahlquist. I also understand that Mr. Coat's spouse is in fact running the Dahlquist campaign in the capacity of campaign manager.

Unlike Ms. Smith, who doesn't bother to identify a violation of RCW 42.17 or Title 390 WAC, Mr. Coats has taken the time to identify a statutory section he asserts was violated; RCW 42.17.130. Beyond that simple assertion, however, Mr. Coats' complaint, on its face, does not show reason to believe that a material violation of that section of chapter 42.17 RCW has occurred. (WAC 390-37-070).

Mr. Coats informs us that he dislikes a Pierce County newsletter discussing my council activities. Newsletters, such as the one he references are part of the normal operations of 20 2010 the Council authorized by the Council administrator for such matters. I am not that person. The decision to distribute newsletters of the sort complained of is a collective decision of the Council managed by the Council Chair.

Mr. Coats, in his complaint, has provided no evidence either supporting, or tending to support, the allegation that a violation of RCW 42.17.130 occurred. Mr. Coats, in his complaint, provides only observations that, though interesting as an insight into the musings of a political activist, offer no evidence whatsoever probative to determining whether a violation of RCW 42.17.130 occurred. Examples:

- Mr. Coats makes the unsupported assertion that statements in the Council's newsletter regarding past events, specifically my past support for job creating strategies, is, in Coats' opinion, "forward looking." Mr. Coats does not explain why this would constitute a violation of RCW 42.17.130. Nor does Coats provide any citation to authority supporting his strange claim that statements describing past events are either "forward looking" or otherwise violations of RCW 42.17.130. One might surmise that, for Coats' purposes, descriptions of past events become 'forward looking' when one is trying to torture logic to conjure a PDC claim into existence. Newsletters, composed of news, typically describe events that have already occurred. I might call your attention to almost any daily newspaper or newsletter for an illustration of this phenomenon. In fact, today's Seattle Times and News Tribune (Aug. 18, 2010) contain articles describing events that occurred yesterday.
- Mr. Coats finds Council newsletter discussion of legislative achievements "clearly
 a campaign statement" without providing any explanation or citation to authority
 to support his claim.
- Mr. Coats complains that the Council newsletter mentions events describing policies also mentioned on a campaign website without bothering to explain why such a circumstance would constitute a violation of RCW 42.17.130. Again, he cites no authority for the proposition that campaigns may not mention the legislative accomplishments of the candidate if those accomplishments are included in news circulated in a Council newsletter. If such is the standard, I'd venture a cross tabulation of most elected office holders at the state level showing press releases and campaign issues would reveal considerable overlap.
- Mr. Coats mentions a robo call that he doesn't like without making any allegations of conduct constituting a violation of RCW 42.17.130. Perhaps he is hoping that respondent or staff will conceive a violation for him. Regardless, he has a minimum obligation to make some statement of fact, or alleged fact, that would constitute a violation and he has failed to do so. Without the complainant actually alleging a violation, I have nothing I can respond to nor does any other party, I would venture.



Kristine M. Smith Communication Rec'd by PDC July 19, 2010

Kristine M. Smith is a resident of Tacoma, WA who also appears to be a political distribustosure Commission. A Twitter page for a Tacoma resident with this name refers to her strategizing with President Obama, her winning tickets to see Obama and Patty Murray, her ideas about Karl Rove 'plots' and her negative impression of Dino Rossi (see attached Exhibit "A"). Her address, listed on the communication as 9905 48th Avenue East, Tacoma, WA 98446, is an address outside the delivery area of the newsletter about which she complains. I have no idea where she obtained the Council's newsletter though I do note that the address on the copy she included with her communication is redacted.

Ms. Smith's communication makes several statements none of which directly allege a violation of RCW 42.17 or Title 390 WAC (as directed on the PDC complaint form). In fact, in her statement under the heading "Alleged Violations" she seems to concede that she has no idea whether any violation has occurred by asking the PDC generically to "use the power of your office to bring to light, and to hold accountable anyone who has violated the spirit or the letter of the law in this situation" neglecting to offer her own ideas as to how the conduct she dislikes, a Council newsletter, might in fact do so. She states alternately the following:

- That I used "public funds for a piece of mail . . . which has obvious political overtimes beyond the scope of council business;"
- She sees irony in the newsletter discussing jobs;
- That communications from public officials come in the form of a newsletter, or letter to their constituent:
- That the Council newsletter came in the form of a "slick full color mailer" that seems to her like "campaign mail;" and
- That the newsletter "fishy."

What she fails to do is allege a violation of RCW 42.17 or Title 390 WAC, neither of which is mentioned in her statement, nor does she offer any explanation, much less citation to authority, clarifying how RCW 42.17 or Title 390 WAC might have been violated. I note that the words 'fishy', 'slick' and 'political overtones' do not appear in RCW 42.17. She offers only her impressions of a Council newsletter and makes conclusions from said impressions that something must be wrong, thus encouraging some other party, the PDC perhaps, to infer wrongdoing from her generic impressions.

WAC 390-37-040, regarding procedures for filing complaints with the commission, provides in pertinent part:

(3) A complaint filed under the provisions of either subsection (1) or (2) of this section shall include:

(a) A statement of the nature of the alleged violation or violations, date Disclosure Commission time and place of each occurrence and name of person or persons responsible;

Given that the Ms. Smith's statement fails to identify any section of RCW 42.17 as actually having been violated, it would appear that the basic threshold for considering her communication a 'complaint' has not been met and her communication should be dismissed for failing to make an actionable allegation.

That Smith must be required to actually allege a violation of some portion of RCW 42.17 prior to triggering PDC action does not seem an undue hardship prior to the expenditure of public resources by the PDC and time and energy by potential respondents. Recall, she likely never received this mailing except through an intermediary unaffiliated with the Council.

Further, the failure by Smith to allege a violation of RCW 42.17 or Title 390 WAC leaves respondents, or PDC staff, with the burden of responding to conjectural allegations. Such would constitute a state of affairs entirely at odds with any notion of procedural due process and fairness. Her statement is too vague and ambiguous to give a respondent, in this instance me, something tangible to address. Further, even if I agreed with everything she asserts in her statement, there still would be no violation of RCW 42.17 alleged. And, I do not choose to speculate as to her intent or meaning.

Anyway, as mentioned above with Mr. Coats, newsletters of the sort which she dislikes are the result of a collective Council policy that has been in existence for many years.

Given that both statements, of Coats and Smith, on their face fail to provide any reason to believe that a material violation of the sections of chapter 42.17 RCW has occurred, I respectfully request that the Executive Director of the PDC dismiss both complaints per WAC 390-37-070.





Our region has been neglected - often in favor of King County - and now our transportation system is nearing collapse. I worked to expand SR 162, SR 167, 1-5, and the Cross-base Highway. The 167 extension alone was estimated to create 80,000 new private sector jobs through trade growth at the Port of Tacoma.

Focus on

Job Creation

The economic downturn is the single greatest challenge facing our families and our county government. Councilmember Bunney has promoted job creation through three major policies:

#1 Simpler, more effective rules and regulations.

Creating new jobs means obeying a mountain of often confusing (and even contradictory) regulations. Councilmember Bunney is leading the effort to rewrite thousands of pages of regulations - making them easier to understand, easier to comply with and still effective.

#2 Lower Fees and Taxes

Stretching Your County Tax Dollar

Every government and family in the United States is coping with the economic downturn. In Pierce County we limited the growth of government during the boom years and we set aside money in a "rainy day" account – at the time we did not know that the proverbial rainy day was just a few years off. Even with this careful planning budget cuts were still necessary. Here is how we managed your county budget:

The Challenge: cope with a \$66 million dollar shortfall in the county budget, while preserving public services.

The total Pierce County budget, at its highest point, was \$880 million. Most of this spending is controlled by state and federal mandates. Just over 1/3 of that number makes up the "general fund" which pays for most of the programs that we think of as county government: sheriff's deputies, the prosecutor's office, general government, parks and other programs. Almost every cut in the county budget must be made to the general fund.

Set Priorities: Public Safety and No New Taxes

As a County Council we thought about the county budget the same way any family would think about its own budget. We set priorities, we decided what had to be protected from cuts and we decided what the county could do without for the duration of the downtum.

Our highest priority was public safety, which accounts for over 75% of the general fund. Unfortunately when you prioritize your largest budget area that means the remainder of the budget must take larger cuts. This allowed us to keep all of our deputy sheriffs on the street, while other counties face large layoffs.

Other local governments and the State of Washington have relied on fax increases to make their budgets work. We decided against this. Our view is that families are struggling to make ends meet, businesses are closing, jobs are being lost. We thought it more rational public policy for the county to tighten its helt, rather than pass more pain on to taxpayers.

 - o Who chose the vendors? Could you use any vendor you wanted? Was there a bid process?

As a Councilmember I had no authority to individually commit funds or enter into contracts. Nor did any staff report to me. Administration of budget and funding for mailers and other district services is the responsibility of the Council Administrator as authorized by the Chair of the Council. The Council practice for allocation of resources budgeted for Council Districts is to share pro rata between Council Districts. All contracts and expenditures must be authorized by the Chair or his/her designee with oversight from the Office of Budget and Finance. Processes for procurement vary. Procurement processes are governed by state law and county code. The mailer went through the same authorization, review, and approval process that every mailer generated by Pierce County for an elected official would be expected to go through. For more information on the County process and procedures, I suggest that you contact Pierce County, the body that authorized and spent public funds on this mailer.

- For the July 2010 mailer (the subject of the complaint), 22,000 pieces were mailed. How was this number of pieces determined? *I assume this number was driven by available budget and past practice.*
 - Was there a county policy limiting the number of pieces you could mail? I am not aware of any limit in number of pieces mailed. Council budget would be the limiting factor.



- For the July 2010 mailer (the subject of the complaint), this mailer looks very different from past mailers you sent as a Pierce County Councilman. Please explain why. *This mailer is not different in any significant way.*
- In the letter portion of the July 2010 mailer, you wrote, "My term as your representative on the Pierce County Council is coming to an end. This is my last newsletter to the district. This letter is in some ways a farewell note but also a thank you note. Thank you for allowing me to serve as your representative to the County Council."
 - Why was the farewell & thank you message sent in July, 2010 and not in November or December, closer to the end of your term? Please explain the reasoning for the timing of this mailing.

Your questions and leading arguments try to make great significance out of mundane events. The elected official mailing was well down the road before the above cited language was drafted. Given that I was completing almost a decade of public service, saying "thank you" seemed appropriate regardless of what month the elected official mailer was sent.



If TEKS Services was the list provider, please tell me the criteria that was used for choosing addresses. Was it based on certain voting districts? zip codes? etc.



I'm trying to determine whether the voting households were located exclusively within Pierce County Council District #1. I am aware that some voters have mailing addresses, in addition to their residential address of record, which may be outside of the district (military, students, etc.) However, I need to know whether all the voting households targeted by Mr. Bunney's 2010 mailer, had an assigned voting district/precinct within Pierce County Council District #1.





I'm starting my second four-year term as your District 1 county councilmember. No Dear Neighbor, one chose to oppose me in the recent election; I hope that means I'm doing a good job for you. I thank you for the opportunity to represent you.

Pierce County can't afford to lose any more family farms.

We already lost more than 80,000 acres of prime farmland from 1987 to 1997, and farmers continue today to accept lucrative buyout offers from developers.

Other farmers sell their land because they grow tired of navigating the county's permitting process or having to go to multiple places for assistance.

Now there's a new tool to help farms. For the first time, there will be a central point of contact for all farming issues in Pierce County: the Farming Assistance, Revitalization and Marketing program (FARM).

Central to the FARM program is the creation of a "Farmbudsman," a farming advocate who will work full time to help the farming community navigate county red tape and connect farmers with the right support agencies.

Second, a 798-FARM assistance phone line puts farmers, restaurateurs and the general public in touch with agencies and instant information.

Third, a new Farm Advisory Board replaces and expands the existing Farm Advisory Commission. Finally, the Food and Farms Connection program will put farmers in touch with consumers by marketing locally grown produce and providing contact information for local farms.

Standing by and watching our agricultural heritage slip away is not an option. We owe it to future generations to ensure that roadside stands and pumpkin patches remain a reality instead of becoming just another memory.


Omr Highways and Jobs

Our economic well-being and our highways are inextricably linked. Degraded highways are an insidious fuel and time tax that each of us pays every day. Bad highways cost us more than fixing them will.

That's primarily why I agreed to be Chairman of the Regional Transportation Investment District (RTID) the past two years. Made up of Pierce, King and Snohomish counties, RTID's assignment is to identify regional highway projects and propose funding to put on your ballot in 2007.

I am chairing RTID also to ensure that our district's road needs are represented, and to make sure that money raised in Pierce County stays in Pierce County.

We need road systems that work efficiently. I'm working to make our area a better place to live, and good roads are an important part of that picture.

Pierce County's \$869.7 million budget allocates 2007 revenue and spending mainly for unincorporated Pierce County and its population of more than 355,000. It is composed of the \$269.2 million general fund - which pays for most county services with revenue from property and sales taxes and fees - and a host of other largely self-supporting funds.

The bulk of the spending is through the county executive departments. Historically it has been difficult for the council to keep on top of spending to the extent it wants.

Starting in 2007 county departments are required to give the council more detailed financial reports before beginning projects that may have fluctuating price tags.

Saving For A Rainy Day

The General fund balance is projected to be \$20 million higher than expenditures next year. Now that economic times are good, this Council put money away for when they aren't.

State Dumping Felons in Pierce County

Pierce County convicts almost as many felons as gigantic King County!! A major reason is that the state saturates Pierce County with convicts released from state prisons, even though the convicts came from other counties.

Over the years the state has set up a disproportionate number of its prison release programs in Pierce County. No matter where the criminal came from, once the person enters a program or commits a crime in Pierce County the state counts that person as a Pierce County resident. When a new crime is committed, it's counted as Pierce County recidivism.

The most effective way to fight recidivism is to keep the state's worst convicts from being introduced into Pierce County in the first place. That costs a lot less than hiring more deputies, judges, prosecutors, and corrections officers to send them back to prison. Convicted felons should be sent back to their original county when they are released.

I'll be working with the county Prosecuting Attorney to keep the state's worst convicts from being introduced into Pierce County. We already have more than our share.



Shawn helped accept the 2006 Cascade Agenda Leadership Award from the Cascade Land Conservancy on behalf of the county council for helping bond funding for the acquisition of more than 1000 acres of farm, forest and open space in Pierce County. Shawn "exhibited true environmental leadership."

Public Safety Increases

Public safety and judicial services account for nearly 74 percent of the county's general fund spending.

For 2007 the council funded three new detectives and one new patrol deputy for the sheriff's department, as well as 12 corrections officers that will allow the opening of a new 80-inmate housing unit (pod) at the county jail.


New Park on the Plateau

We're getting a new 80-acre regional county park in the Bonney Lake area. The property is part of a three-way land exchange between the county, White River School District and a developer.

East Pierce County is growing rapidly. The need for a regional county park is great, and the site at 128th Street East and 198th Avenue is ideal.

The design process has already begun. Because I want the park in operation as soon as possible I've made sure that \$1.9 million is already identified for initial design and development.

Children's programs and public safety were this year's focus. The council reduced other areas to fund these vital programs without raising taxes, for a no-net-increase budget.

Funding of a new Superior Court judge was accelerated by three months to help address a growing case backlog. Two sheriff's deputies were added. Funds were restored to help neighbors band together to prevent crime. The Council asked the Sheriff to begin planning for a new jail and to propose more alternatives to incarceration.

For kids, the council increased funding for United Way Early Learning, Boys and Gitls Clubs, and Community Health Care, which is building its new clinic in the Salishan neighborhood. Parks & Recreation Services was funded to provide activities for children with developmental disabilities.

A Legia To The Governor

I sent this letter to Governor Gregoire on November 28 to help keep Seattle hands out of Pierce County wallets for road repair.

Dear Governor Gregoire,

Among the reasons I agreed to chair RTID were the desire to ensure that Pierce County projects were selected for their economic impact, to make sure that taxes raised in Pierce County stayed in Pierce County, and to provide leadership for our region in purting forward funding answers to regional road congestion.

Thanks in large part to King County Executive Ron Sims and the Seattle Times, voters were led to believe there is a better way to fund regional transportation. I am telling Pierce County taxpayers HOLD ON TO YOUR POCKETBOOKS!

I am sure that before voters went to bed on election night some Seattle legislators were busy ramping up for another raid of the region's road funds...funds they say are for a \$4.4 billion "Safety" project called the 520 Bridge.

This is the same group that siphoned \$700 million in gas taxes out of Pierce County in the past fifteen years.

We heard this story yet again in 2006 when the same Seattle interests took almost \$400 million out of Pierce County wallets to replace the Alaskan Way Viaduct; a viaduct, it turns out, not wanted by Seattle because it blocks the view.

To say that the 520 Bridge is a "Safety" project does not accurately portray the planned gold-plated entrances to the Emerald City and Clyde Hill/Medina. Current plans include \$100 million for bike and pedestrian lanes, \$250 million for five new parks created to muffle bridge noise, \$700-\$800 million for parks and lids on the east side of the lake, and a 50% capacity increase. The only thing missing is a giant archway from which trumpets can blare as Ron Sims enters and exits Seattle.

The scene is set for another contrived feeding frenzy in the legislature, which will leave Pierce County with crumbs.

I am hoping you see the advantage of thinking independently of the Seattle-centric view of the world.

As RTID chair over these years I have heard all there is about every prospective project advocated in the tri-county region. Of all the projects brought before RTID I believe the project with the most potential is SR 167.

Governor, Washington State needs a fully funded SR 167 jobs project. Extending SR 167 to the Port of Tacoma will create 80,000 new jobs regionally. That road that currently ends in a corn field in Puyallup absolutely needs to be extended to the Port of Tacoma where it can boost the economy of the entire state.

The SR 167 extension is a legacy project.

No other construction project in the state offers 80,000 new jobs.

No other industry in the state anticipates 80,000 new jobs.

No other Governor in memory has had the opportunity to lock in 80,000 virtually guaranteed new jobs.

This is a once-in-a-career opportunity to impact generations of Washingtonians.

Governor, let's talk. We can meet one on one. If you prefer, I can bring a delegation of business owners, investors, and port officials. But with all due respect I am putting you on notice that Pierce County will not accept its tax dollars being ripped off yet again to pay for King County parks and 520 Bridge bike and pedestrian projects. Every political candidate and every elected official at every level in every possible public venue will be asked if they support SR 167 and the 80,000 new jobs the project offers.



The council made reductions in other areas so we can fund these vital programs without raising taxes. This is a no-net-increase budget.


Protecting Open Spaces: Transfer of Development Rights


