I. INTRODUCTION

This matter was heard by the Washington State Public Disclosure Commission (Commission) on October 25, 2018, at the Public Disclosure Commission Office, 711 Capitol Way, Room 206, Olympia, Washington 98504. The hearing was held pursuant to Chapter 34.05 RCW, Chapter 42.17A RCW, and Chapter 390-37 WAC.

Commissioners present were Anne Levinson, Commission Chair (presiding); David Ammons, Commission Vice-Chair; and Commissioner William Downing. Also present were Assistant Attorney General John S. Meader representing the Commission; Tabatha Blacksmith and Fox Blackhorn-Delph, Compliance Coordinators on behalf of PDC Staff; and Assistant Attorney General Chad Standifer representing PDC Staff. Respondent Brandi Holmes did not participate. The proceeding was open to the public and recorded.

The hearing concerned allegations that Respondent Brandi Holmes violated RCW 42.17A.700 by failing to timely file a Personal Financial Affairs Statement (F-1 Report) for

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16	II. FINDINGS OF FACT
17	1. Brandi Holmes was elected to the City Council for the City of Westport in 2015.
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19	2. Per RCW 42.17A.700, Ms. Holmes was required to file a Personal Financial Affairs
20	Statement (F-1 report) disclosing personal financial information for calendar year 2017 no later
21	than April 16, 2018.

23	3. From April to June of 2018, PDC staff sent seven email reminders to Ms. Holmes
24	concerning the F-1 filing requirement.
25	4. On July 16, 2018 PDC staff sent a warning letter by U.S. Mail, concerning Ms.
26	Holmes's failure to file the F-1 report.
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I	6. On August 16, 2018 PDC staff served Ms. Holmes by U.S. mail and email, with a
2	hearing notice for a Brief Adjudicative Proceeding to be held on September 24, 2018,
3	concerning the failure to timely file the F-1 report.

5	7. On September 24, 2018, a Brief Adjudicative Proceeding was held in which the
6	Presiding Officer determined that, in accordance with WAC 390-37-143(5), Ms. Holmes's case
7	needed to be scheduled before the full Commission for an enforcement action as:
8	 She was found in violation in the previous reporting period; and
9	 The violation remained in effect following any appeals.

11	8. On September 24, 2018, Brandi Holmes filed an F-1 report for calendar year 2017,
12	which was due no later than April 16, 2018.
13	9. On October 15, 2018, PDC staff served Ms. Holmes by U.S. mail and email, with a
14	hearing notice for an Adjudicative Proceeding before the full Public Disclosure Commission, to
15	be held on October 25, 2018, concerning the failure to timely file the F-1 report.
16	be need on October 23, 2016, concerning the failure to timery the the F-1 report.
17	10. Brandi Holmes failed to timely file an F-1 report for calendar year 2016, which was
18	due no later than April 15, 2017 (PDC Case 22255). On August 13, 2017, Ms. Holmes filed a
19	signed Statement of Understanding and paid a \$100 penalty for violating RCW 42.17A.700. On
20	August 17, 2017, Brandi Holmes filed an F-1 report for calendar year 2016, which was due no
21	later than April 17, 2017.
22	III. CONCLUSIONS OF LAW
23	1. The Commission has jurisdiction over this proceeding pursuant to Chapter 42.17A
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25	RCW, the State campaign finance and disclosure law; Chapter 34.05 RCW, the Administrative
26	Procedure Act; and Title 390 WAC.
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2	2. The Respondent violated RCW 42.17A.700 by failing to file a Personal Financial
3	Affairs Statement (F-1 Report) disclosing personal financial information for calendar year 2017
4	no later than April 16, 2018.
5	IV. ORDER
6	Based upon the Findings and Conclusions, the Commission Orders that:
7	Bused apon the 1 manigs and conclusions, the commission orders that.
8	Respondent Brandi Holmes is assessed a total civil penalty of \$500 for violation
9	of RCW 42.17A.700 which is payable within 30 days of the date of this Order.
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11	2. The Respondent shall remain in compliance with all PDC reporting requirements.
