FINAL ORDER

I. INTRODUCTION

This matter was heard by the Washington State Public Disclosure Commission (Commission) on October 25, 2018, at the Public Disclosure Commission Office, 711 Capitol Way, Room 206, Olympia, Washington 98504. The hearing was held pursuant to Chapter 34.05 RCW, Chapter 42.17A RCW, and Chapter 390-37 WAC.

Commissioners present were Anne Levinson, Commission Chair (presiding); David Ammons, Commission Vice-Chair; and Commissioner William Downing. Also present were Assistant Attorney General John S. Meader representing the Commission; Tabatha Blacksmith and Fox Blackhorn-Delph, Compliance Coordinators on behalf of PDC Staff; and Assistant Attorney General Chad Standifer representing PDC Staff. Respondent Dayn Brunner did not participate. The proceeding was open to the public and recorded.

The hearing concerned allegations that Respondent Dayn Brunner violated RCW 42.17A.700 by failing to timely file a Personal Financial Affairs Statement (F-1 Report) for

1 calendar year 2017, due not later than April 16, 2018.

2 The Commissioners had before them the following materials:

- 5 • Warning Letter for missing Personal Financial Affairs Statement from PDC staff dated July

8 2018, including information for submitting a Statement of Understanding by September 19,
9 2018, and a copy of the Brief Enforcement Hearings penalty schedule.
- 10 • F-1 Enforcement Hearing Notice dated October 15, 2018, indicating the Brief Enforcement
11 Hearing was converted to an Enforcement Hearing before the full Commission on October
12 25, 2018.
- 13 • Cover letter and Initial Order Imposing Fine (PDC Case 22218), dated September 5, 2017.

14 **II. FINDINGS OF FACT**

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16 1. Dayn Brunner was elected Fire Commissioner for Snohomish County Fire Protection
17 District 24 in 2017.

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19 2. Per RCW 42.17A.700, Mr. Brunner was required to file a Personal Financial Affairs
20 Statement (F-1 report) disclosing personal financial information for calendar year 2017 no later
21 than April 16, 2018.

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23 3. From April to June of 2018, PDC staff sent seven email reminders to Mr. Brunner
24 concerning the F-1 filing requirement.

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26 4. On July 16, 2018 PDC staff sent a warning letter by U.S. Mail, concerning Mr.
Brunner's failure to file the F-1 report.

1 RCW, the State campaign finance and disclosure law; Chapter 34.05 RCW, the Administrative
2 Procedure Act; and Title 390 WAC.

3 2. Respondent violated RCW 42.17A.700 by failing to file a Personal Financial Affairs
4 Statement (F-1 Report) disclosing personal financial information for calendar year 2017 no later
5 than April 16, 2018.

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7 **IV. ORDER**

8 Based upon the Findings and Conclusions, the Commission Orders that:

- 10 1. Respondent Dayn Brunner is assessed a total civil penalty of \$1,500 for violation
11 of RCW 42.17A.700, payable within 30 days of the date of this order.
 - 12 2. The Respondent shall also pay all prior PDC civil penalties, file the F-1 reports
13 for calendar years 2016 and 2017, and remain in compliance with all PDC
14 reporting requirements.
