Dear Sir:

I am formally filing a complaint against City of SeaTac Councilmember Mia Gregerson and the Firefighters Union IAFF for violating RCW 42.17 or Title 390 WAC.

Mia Gregerson and Ms. Brandt-Schluter organized and scheduled meetings at non-profit agency facilities and Angle Lake residents' homes, thus including other city staff and their spouses to ensure the defeat of Proposition #1 and obtain endorsements from the firefighters for their chosen candidates running for SeaTac City Council.

IAFF Union President John Gallup and Adam Renn (IAFF SeaTac City Political Action Committee) also used city email and resources, actively strategizing, not only about endorsements, but also to the opposition of Proposition #1.

The city firefighters used numerous city vehicles to go to the Bow Lake Mobile Home Park to a Firefighters Breakfast and then openly distributed flyers, soliciting opposition to the Change of Government (COG).

The city has attempted multiple cover-ups to avoid addressing these illegalities. They delayed release of emails for over a year, jeopardizing availability of evidence because of records retention limits. They even hired a consultant to create a sham investigation report to whitewash the violations.

Enclosed are copies of pertinent emails of the literally thousands of emails I have obtained between Mia Gregerson and Colleen Brandt-Schluter, including emails from SeaTac City Firefighters that clearly depict these serious violations.

The last email will show the same tendency started in February of 2010, using city email by Pat Patterson (Facilities Manager) to strategize for the 2011 election of which they were not only successful in stopping the COG, but electing two of their team members (Dave Bush and Barry Ladenburg) to the City Council, allegedly violating RCW.42.A.335 in the process. *This is to be determined at a later date by the Attorney General's Office.*

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All enclosed emails can be verified by SeaTac's Legal Department.

Awareness of these illegal activities has spread beyond SeaTac into the entire Northwest region and is affecting SeaTac's reputation and credibility. The community has published a web site - www.seataccoverup.com and they plan to publish the actions of the Public Disclosure Commission (PDC) to ensure these illegal actions are properly addressed. The citizens are weary of continued cover-ups and they want the PDC to simply enforce our laws.

Dear Mr. Stutzman:

I have reviewed the Complaint you provided, along with the materials submitted with the Complaint by Aileen Fisher.

The vast majority of the materials submitted by Ms. Fisher do not relate to any activity by Mr. Gallup or Mr. Renn. I will not address those materials.

My understanding is the Ms. Fisher and her colleagues have submitted repeated Freedom of Information Act requests, which have generated several thousand pages of documents. Of those thousands of documents, Ms. Fisher asserts that 16 emails show that Mr. Gallup and Mr. Renn utilized City resources to support candidates for the city council of SeaTac. A list of those emails, with brief discussion of each is submitted as Appendix A to this letter. The referenced emails are attached as Appendix B.

With this letter, I am also submitting statements by Mr. Gallup and Mr. Renn, and excerpts from the Collective Bargaining Agreement between IAFF Local 2919 and the City of SeaTac.

The vague assertions by Ms. Fisher that Mr. Gallup and/or Mr. Renn used uniforms, trucks, and the like, for partisan purposes are completely without basis. Fire department personnel and equipment were present at the Bow Lake Residential Community breakfast. However, as explained by Mr. Gallup at the paragraph I have numbered 14 in his statement, the breakfast was a semi-annual community event with no political agenda whatsoever. To the extent that any partisan activity occurred at the breakfast, it consisted of persons associated with the complainant arriving at the event – which was open to the public – and engaging in political activities. Neither Mr. Gallup, Mr. Renn, nor any other firefighter engaged in any partisan activity at the event. Mr. Fisher's assertion that firefighters distributed flyers soliciting

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opposition to the Change in Government is simply false. As Mr. Gallup explains, the firefighters neither prepared nor distributed any such leaflets.

The emails provided by Ms. Fisher do not support her assertion that Mr. Gallup and Mr. Renn utilized email and resources to strategize regarding endorsements and opposition to Proposition 1. There is no evidence that city email was utilized in any respect with regard to Proposition 1. At most, there were isolated occasions when communications regarding endorsements were inadvertently directed to or from city email.

As discussed below, most of the emails do not violate RCW 42.17A.550 ("the statute") because they were not "for the purpose of assisting a campaign for election of any person to any office or for the promotion of or opposition to a ballot proposition." Specifically, the text of the emails I have numbered 1, 2, 4, 5, 6, 7, 9, 12, 13, 14 and 15 reflect that they are not for the purpose of supporting or opposing candidates or ballot propositions and therefore are plainly not in violation of the statute.

Two emails – numbers 3 and 8 – reflect that other persons sent arguably partisan emails to Mr. Gallup's email address, but not in response to partisan activities or communications sent via city email by Mr. Gallup. I respectfully submit that the persons who receive a partisan email are not in violation of RCW 42.17A.550 if they have not solicited a partisan email, and do not use public resources to respond to the partisan email. If it were a violation to receive unsolicited partisan emails, the complaint in *Herbert v. Washington State PDC*, 136 Wn.App. 249 (2006) would have included all the teachers who received Herbert's communication in their school mailbox.

The only email sent by Mr. Gallup that was arguably related to supporting a candidate or ballot measure was a two line email sent on September 28, 2009 (paragraph 10), confirming the time and place to have coffee with Councilmember Mr. Standridge, who had previously asked whether the Firefighters had given any reconsideration to endorsements of candidates. Mr. Standridge later sent an email on October 4 about his plans to pick up endorsement signs (paragraph 11). There is no indication that Mr. Gallup indicated that Mr. Standridge should use his city email address for this communication. In fact, the October 23, 2009 email in which Mr. Gallup forwarded the email about meeting for coffee and the endorsement signs to his home email (paragraph 12).

The only other documents that warrant discussion are those between officials of the Firefighters. Paragraph 9 consists of an exchange between Mr. Gallup and the Washington State Council of Firefighters about contribution limits. Such an inquiry regarding compliance with state law does not constitute assistance in a campaign. The emails referenced at paragraph 16 appear to have been misdirected to Mr. Renn's city email. As the email addresses reflect, Mr. Gallup was writing from his home "harboret" email address. However, it appears that on this one occasion, Mr. Renn received arguably partisan email at his city email address.

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In the final analysis, the worst that can be said in this case is that Mr. Gallup's two line email agreeing to a time and place for coffee with Mr. Standridge could be construed as a violation, notwithstanding the CBA language at Article 5.08, which expressly permits firefighters – who work extremely long shifts – may use city email for union communications.


Likewise, at worst, there was a single occasion when Mr. Renn received emails from Mr. Gallup at his work email about when and where he would be picked up to attend a political event.

While the decision in *Herbert* indicates there is no *de minimis* exception to RCW 42.17A.550, the fact that, even after obtaining tens of thousands of pages of documents, Ms. Fisher submitted only two arguably improper emails suggests that this is a situation that does not warrant enforcement action by the PDC.

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Appendix A

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Items referenced in John Gallup Statement dated June 14, 2012:

1. January 15, 2009 email is not “for the purpose of assisting a campaign for election of any person to any office or for the promotion or opposition of any ballot proposition.” It is clear from the text of the email that the subjects of the email include legislative action, which is not subject to RCW 42.17A.555. The email also references “questionnaires” and “interviews” with candidates. A decision regarding candidate support is made after questionnaires and interviews are completed. Therefore, these preliminary evaluations do not come within the prohibition of the statute because they are not “for the purpose of assisting a campaign for election.”
2. March 5, 2009 email to Rep. Uptegrove references legislative concerns, and makes no reference to either candidates or ballot propositions. Therefore, it is not within the prohibition of the statute.
3. June 15, 2009 from Gregerson to Gallup. Because Mr. Gallup has no control over who sends him emails, I do not believe his receipt of an unsolicited email can form the basis for a violation. July 2, 2009 email from Gallup to Ladenburg. This email is to a sitting council member to arrange a meeting to address city issues of concern to the Local. This activity is arguably lobbying, which is not addressed by the statute. It neither supports a candidate nor assists in the promotion or opposition of a ballot proposition. Note also that Mr. Gallup forwarded the email to his home email. Although Ladenburg’s email of July 6 references Ms. Gregerson and copies her, Mr. Gallup did not respond. Note also that on October 23, 2009, Mr. Gallup forwarded this email to his home computer to assure that any further communications would not utilize fire department resources.
4. August 31, 2009 email from Renn to Gallup. This email relates to a non-partisan Candidate Guide listing all candidates, without supporting or opposing any candidate. It was prepared in preparation for the non-partisan Candidate’s Forum on September 17, 2009. Because it is non-partisan, it is prohibited by the statute.
5. This flyer is for a non-partisan Candidates’ Forum, which was presented as a public service by the Local, and included all candidates. Holding such a non-partisan forum does not violate the statute because it “does not assist in a campaign for election of any person.”
6. September 23, 2009 email from Gallup to Shape and others. This email was sent to all council members to address confusion about whether attending the Candidate Forum would have violated the Open Meetings Act. Note that the email explains that the Candidate Forum was a non-partisan event.
7. September 26, 2009 email from Standridge to Gallup. This is an unsolicited email from Standridge. As the email string reflects, it was sent by Standridge in response to the email from Gallup to several elected officials that is referenced in paragraph 7. As discussed in Paragraph 3, Mr. Gallup is not guilty of violating the statute when others send unsolicited partisan communications to his email address.

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8. September 26, 2009 Gallup email exchange with Keven@wscff.org. This is a discussion about contribution limits and compliance with state laws. It is for the purpose of assuring compliance with statutes, not for the purpose of assisting a campaign for election.
9. September 27, 28, and 30 emails between Gallup and Standridge. As Standridge was an incumbent City Council member, as is reflected in his email address, a meeting between the Captain of the Fire Department and Standridge is not impermissible. Although Standridge references his hope for an endorsement, Mr. Gallup's emails do not indicate that his purpose in meeting was to assist Standridge's campaign.
10. October 4, 2009 email from Standridge to Gallup. This is an unsolicited email regarding assistance for Standridge's campaign.
11. October 23, 2009 Gallup to Gallup. This is an email from Mr. Gallup's work email to his home email. As Mr. Gallup explains, he was not able to access his home email from work. The list of attachments to the email reflects that Mr. Gallup was redirecting the arguably partisan emails from Standridge, as well as Gallup's responses, to his home email, to assure that he was not using City resources in connection with partisan activity.
12. September 30, 2009 email from Gallup to Julia Patterson. As the text reflects, in this email, Mr. Gallup was assuring Ms. Patterson, who is a legislator, communicated via his home email and home phone number.
13. October 2, 2009 email from Gallup to C, B, and A Shifts. This is a reminder regarding a semi-annual community event, which was completely non-partisan – although certain candidates associated with the complainant took advantage of the fact that it was open to the public to engage in political activity at the event.
14. October 13, 2009 emails between Gallup and Will Aho. These emails relate to the effort to create a Regional Fire Authority in South King County. This was not the subject of a ballot proposition. The complainant alleges that the Local only supported candidates who agreed with the RFA proposal. Even if that were true (and I don't know whether it is), it would not convert communications regarding the RFA into violations of RCW 42.17A.550.
15. May 22, 23, 2010 emails between Renn and Gallup. The emails are between union officials and therefore are proper under the terms of the CBA. To the extent that the statute is implicated, note that the email address used by Mr. Gallup was his home email, rather than his work email. It appears there was an inadvertent error by sending the email to Mr. Renn at his city email address and Mr. Renn responding from that address.

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Excerpts of CBA

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5.03 Union Work Replacement

The Union shall be allowed to provide work replacements of equal rank or abilities to act in that rank for Union Officials or designated representatives provided there is no cost or inconvenience to the Fire Department. However, the employee shall be responsible to ensure that all training requirements are satisfied at no cost to the City and such absences will not adversely affect the employee's ability to perform his or her job.

5.04 Union Bulletin Board

The City will allow the Union to erect and maintain one (1) bulletin board at each station at Union expense in a location mutually agreed upon by both parties. This bulletin board shall be used only for official union business or social activities. No publicly inappropriate materials will be allowed, and will be removed at the discretion of the Fire Chief or his/her designee.

5.05 Except as herein provided, the Union or any member of the Union shall not conduct any official Union business on the City's time or premises without express permission of the Fire Chief or his/her designee.

5.06 The City will recognize the elected President or any other member of the Union appointed by the President to represent the employees of the bargaining unit. The Union agrees to notify the City in writing of duly accredited representatives of the Union upon election or appointment.

5.07 The City agrees to permit members of the Union to have access to the City's premises for the purpose of negotiations, adjusting grievances, or conferring with other union members, so long as it does not interfere with the Fire Department's operations. In addition, the City agrees to permit properly identified non-employee representatives of the Union to have access to the City's premises for the purpose of negotiations, adjusting grievances, or conferring with other union members, provided that such representatives obtain advance permission from the Fire Chief or his/her designee, notify the Fire Chief of the reason for their presence, and do not interfere with the Fire Department's operations.

5.08 The Union agrees not to utilize City equipment for Union business with the exception of electronic mail and copy machine, which shall be used in accordance with City policy, as it currently exists and is hereafter amended. Cost of copies will be paid back to the City at a fair and reasonable rate determined by the City.

ARTICLE 6 - PERSONNEL FILES

6.01 The contents of the personnel files, including the personal photographs, shall be confidential and shall be restricted to the internal use of the City; provided that information contained in the personnel files may be released to any individuals or organizations upon written authorization of both the City and the employee. Copies of the contents of the personnel file shall be released to the Union in the event of disciplinary proceedings.

6.02 An employee may review the contents of his/her personnel file in its entirety during normal business office hours upon reasonable request.

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Statement from Mr. Gallup

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June 13th, 2012

I am writing to address the specific allegations made by in the Complaint.

My primary response is that my activities were in connection with my position as the President of IAFF Local 2919, and the Collective Bargaining Agreement between the Local and the City of SeaTac specifically permits the local to use the City's email to conduct union business.

In addition, several of the emails referenced in the Complaint relate to activities that are not partisan, and therefore would not violate the PDA in any event.

Finally, as several of the emails reflect, my normal practice was to refer any emails regarding partisan political activities to my personal email address. Most emails regarding partisan activities were sent by others to my work email, which, because it uses a standard addressing convention, is available to all City employees and officials, even if I have not provided it to them. It was only on very isolated occasions that I used my work email to send any partisan communications to persons other than union members. I respectfully submit that these very isolated activities do not warrant enforcement action by the PDC.

I will address the emails and alleged events in chronological order:

January 15, 2009 from Adam Renn to John Gallup and reply: This is an email regarding union activity between Adam Renn, who was the political action director for the Local, and myself. Therefore, it is permitted by the terms of the CBA. It is also more than three years before the complaint.

March 5, 2009 from Adam Renn to Dave Upthegrove and reply: This email relates to a meeting to determine Mr. Upthegrove's views on legislative issues of interest to the Local and the City of SeaTac. It was not a partisan political activity.

③ June 15, 2009 Mia Gregerson to John Gallup: This is an email that was sent to me by a city official. There is no indication that I used city email to respond. I do not believe I am responsible for the fact that other persons in the city send unsolicited emails to my city email address.

④ July 2, 2009 Gallup to Barry Landenburg, and July 6 Landenburg to Gallup (at top of page is October 23, 2009 Gallup to Gallup email): The email from me to Landenburg, who was a sitting council member, was to address city issues of concern to the Local. I believe this is consistent with the CBA and does not constitute partisan political activity. Note also that I forwarded the email to my home email (hence Gallup to Gallup) because my general practice is to conduct political activity from my home email (to which I did not have access during my shifts).

⑤ August 31, 2009 Renn to Gallup: This is an email that falls within our rights under the CBA. In addition, the document referenced is not partisan. It was a guide listing all the candidates for City offices and was for use in connection with a non-partisan candidate forum to be hosted by the Local.

6 September 17, 2009 Flyer re Candidate Forum: This is a flyer for a non-partisan candidate forum to which all candidates for city council, as well as current members of the council were invited. It was a community service and was strictly non-partisan in character.

7 September 23, 2009 Gallup to Shape and others: This is an email regarding the September 17 forum. There was some concern among city council members that if all council members came, it would constitute a meeting as to which rules regarding public notice was required. Please note that the text of the email explains that the forum was a non-partisan event.

8 September 26, 2009 Standridge to Gallup: This is an unsolicited email following up on the non-partisan candidates' forum.

9 September 26, 2009 Gallup to Keven@wscff.org: This is an intra-union email, which I believe is permitted under the terms of the CBA. It is also communication with the state council regarding the requirements of the Public Disclosure Law. As such, it is not an impermissible use of public resources to aid a candidate or political committee.

10 September 28 email from Gallup to Standridge and September 30, 2009 email from Standridge to Gallup: This is an isolated occasion when I used city email to arrange a meeting with a council member. My email does not indicate that the meeting would have a partisan character, although Standridge's reply references an endorsement.

11 October 4, 2009 email from Standridge to Gallup: This is an unsolicited email regarding a partisan issue.

12 October 23, 2009 email from Gallup to Gallup (Re: endorsement signs, coffee on Wednesday, etc.): This is an email from my work email to my home email, so I could redirect email communications with Standridge to my home email, which was my normal practice.

13 September 30, 2009 Gallup to Julia Patterson: The sole function of this email is to direct Ms. Patterson to my home mail and my personal phone number.

14 October 2, 2009 from Gallup to B Shift, C Shift and A Shift: This is an email from me in my capacity as Captain to all shifts of firefighters, reminding them to attend the semi-annual breakfast with the Bow Lake Residential Community. The breakfast is a community event, and historically has had no partisan political component. Some candidates arrived uninvited to the event – which is open to the public – and engaged in political activity. However, the candidates were not urged to do so by the Local or by me. Candidates present were those associated with the complainant and incumbents. The Local did not distribute flyers at the event. In fact, the Local never prepared any flyers regarding proposition 1 in the election in November 2009.

15 October 19, 2009 email from waho@comcast.net and email from John Gallup to waho@comcast.net. This is a communication with a fire fighter from the City of Renton union concerning discussions and meetings that were taking place amongst fire departments in south King County about the potential of forming Regional Fire Authorities.






