

<b>Complaint Description</b>
<a href="#"><u>Iknowshayna</u></a> (Mon, 6 Aug at 3:58 PM) Mychal Schwartz is running to be a District Court Judge in King Co. NE/Snohomish Co. It's extremely worrisome that someone who is vying to be a Judge, has such flagrant disregard for the laws that govern elections in Washington state. Mr. Schwartz has repeatedly violated multiple sections of the law, despite running on his experience as an attorney, judge pro tempore, and Industrial Appeals Judge. Public confidence in the judiciary can not be maintained when judicial candidates see themselves as above the law and do not follow the rules established for candidates to ensure transparency in campaign spending.

## **Violations**

### **1. FAILURE TO FILE AN ACCURATE, TIMELY C4 IN THE 21 DAYS BEFORE A PRIMARY (Violation of RCW 42.17A.235)**

State law requires that candidates regularly file reports to the Public Disclosure Commission (PDC) that include details for all contributions (monetary and in-kind), expenditures, loans, and debts. RCW 42.17A.235 explicitly lays out the requirements for this:

“(2) Each treasurer of a candidate or political committee or incidental committee required to file a statement of organization under this chapter shall file with the commission a report containing the information required by RCW 42.17A.240 at the following intervals:

(a) On the twenty-first day and the seventh day immediately preceding the date on which the election is held;”

Mr. Schwartz has failed to submit timely C4 reports to the PDC, despite running for District Court Judge on his experience as an attorney and having previously run for public office in Washington. In doing so, he has obfuscated the public’s right to know how he is spending campaign money in the critical time period before the 2018 primary election.

Mr. Schwartz failed to file a C4 covering the period of 6/1/18 to 7/16/18/ by the legal deadline of 7/17/18. He filed report #100846349 on 7/22/18, five days after the deadline.

### **2. FAILURE TO FILE AN ACCURATE, TIMELY C4 (Violation of RCW 42.17A.235)**

RCW 42.17A.235)(c) requires that reports of expenditures and contributions are due “On the tenth day of each month in which no other reports are required to be filed under this section.”

Mr. Schwartz failed to file the C4 covering the time period of 03/14/2018 to 03/31/2018 by the legal deadline of 4/10/18. He submitted C4 report #100826407 on April 20th, meaning that this report was ten days overdue.

### **3. FAILURE TO FILE AN ACCURATE, TIMELY C4 ON THE SEVENTH (7TH) DAY BEFORE A PRIMARY (Violation of RCW 42.17A.235)**

Willfully neglecting the required deadline for the second report in a row and for the third time of this campaign cycle, Mr. Schwartz failed to file a C4 covering the period of 7/17/18 to 7/30/18/ by the legal deadline of 7/31/18.

#### **4. FAILURE TO PROPERLY BREAK DOWN, DESCRIBE EXPENSES (Violation of RCW 42.17A.235, RCW 42.17A.240 see WAC 390-16-037)**

In order to keep citizens informed of how candidates are spending campaign contributions, state law requires that candidates and their committees must report the purpose of an expenditure and describe in detail the goods and/or services to be provided by the recipient of the expenditure. WAC 390-16-037 explicitly outlines and gives an example of how campaigns must describe in detail what kind of printed materials were purchased, their quantity, alongside the vendor and amount.

On his C4 report # 100827545 submitted on 5/2/18, Mr. Schwartz listed an expense of "Printed Items" at the cost of \$400.10 to Trade Printery on 4/30/18. "Printed items" is not specific enough to meet the threshold of the statute since the purpose and quantity are not stated.

Mychal Schwartz illegally failed to break down the purpose and quantity of items printed as required for the C4 report.

#### **5. FAILURE TO REPORT DEBT Violation of RCW 42.17A.235, WAC 390-05-295**

State law requires that the name and address of any person and the amount owed for any debt, obligation, note, unpaid loan, or other liability in the amount of more than two hundred fifty dollars or in the amount of more than fifty dollars that has been outstanding for over thirty days. WAC 390-05-295 expands the definition of expenditures to add that "'promise' or 'promise to pay' includes any oral or written order placed, debt or obligation to purchase goods or services or anything of value, or any offer to purchase advertising space, broadcast time or other advertising related product or service."

On July 11, Mr. Schwartz's campaign ordered 250 yards from Overnight Printing in Seattle, WA. Overnight Printing's union bug as well as "Paid for by the Committee to Elect Mychal Schwartz" are clearly displayed toward the center bottom of the yard signs that have been distributed across east King County, seen on the street as early July 19<sup>th</sup>.

Overnight Printing's owner, David Seo, confirmed by phone that Mr. Schwartz's campaign ordered the yard signs on July 11<sup>th</sup>, 2018 but did not pay for the signs until July 18<sup>th</sup>, 2018. Since the yard signs were an obligation of more than \$50, they needed to be reported. Mr. Schwartz failed to report an obligation for yard signs on the C4 that covered the time period of 6/1/18 to 7/16/18/ and was due on 7/17/18.

#### **6. FAILURE TO INCLUDE SPONSOR ID ON WEBSITE Violation of RCW 42.17A.320(1)**

State law requires that the sponsor's name and address be included on all written political advertising to inform citizens of who is paying for advertisements. Websites are included in the statutory definition of written political advertising; therefore, they are required display sponsor identification and address.

Mr. Schwartz maintains a website, an online donation page, and a Facebook page for his campaign. Sponsor identification is not included on any of these three pages with the accurate name of his committee. Mr. Schwartz's campaign name, as declared on his C1, is "Committee to Elect Mychal Schwartz." Furthermore, he does not include the required language "Paid for by" on any of these three pages. Lastly, he did not share the address of his campaign committee on his website, donation page, or Facebook page.

Mr. Schwartz has repeatedly violated provisions of the sponsor ID requirement—1. 'Paid for by' language 2. The proper name of his committee 3. Address for his committee—on his website at <https://www.schwartzforjudge.org/>, his donation page at [www.schwartzforjudge.org/donate](http://www.schwartzforjudge.org/donate), and his campaign Facebook page at <https://www.facebook.com/schwartzforjudge/>.

## **7. FAILURE TO INCLUDE SPONSOR ID ON ADVERTISEMENTS (Violation of RCW 42.17A.320)**

RCW 42.17A.320(1) could not be more clear: "All written political advertising, whether relating to candidates or ballot propositions, shall include the sponsor's name and address."

Mr. Schwartz took out two ads on Facebook for his campaign that ran between July 21st and July 30th and an additional ad for Neither advertisement included the sponsor ID, as required by WAC 390-05-290. Facebook removed the ads for not having a "Paid for by" disclaimer.

By not having the proper sponsor identification, Mr. Schwartz failed to follow the laws governing political advertisements.

## **8. LATE REPORTING OF EXPENDITURES, IN-KIND CONTRIBUTIONS, DEBT. (Violation of RCW 42.17A.235, .240)**

Mr. Schwartz reported in-kind contributions from himself to his campaign for a haircut (\$29) and a tie (\$19.77), specifically listing the date of 3/14/18. However, he did not report photography services until 7/05/18 in the amount of \$214.50 on his C4 100846349. If Mr. Schwartz actually took campaign photos close in time to the in-kind contribution of a haircut and tie, he reported the expenditure for photographs approximately 120 days late.

## **9. FAILURE TO PROPERLY BREAK DOWN, DESCRIBE EXPENSES**

**(Violation of RCW 42.17A.235, RCW 42.17A.240 see WAC 390-16-037)**

By state law, candidates and their committees must report the purpose of an expenditure and describe in detail the goods and/or services to be provided by the recipient of the expenditure. WAC 390-16-037 explicitly outlines and gives an example of how campaigns must describe in detail what kind of printed materials were purchased, their quantity, alongside the vendor and amount.

On his C4 report # 100849679 submitted on 8/1/18, Mr. Schwartz listed two expenses paid to Overnight Printing:

“Printing Fee” and “Printing” do not meet the standard set by Washington state law for reporting because the expenses are not described and do not list a quantity.

Mychal Schwartz failed to break down the purpose and quantity of items printed as required for the C4 report.

## **10. LATE REPORTING OF EXPENDITURES, IN-KIND CONTRIBUTIONS, DEBT.**

**(Violation of RCW 42.17A.235, .240)**

Mr. Schwartz has a number of items that appear to have been professionally designed, yet has failed to report expenditures or in-kind contributions many items that cost money or have value from a professional designer’s time and skill that should be reported, even if they were done by volunteers as an in-kind donation. Oftentimes, these things are done by campaign staff, however Mr. Schwartz has not reported having paid or volunteer staff at any point. Additionally, treasury services require professional help that must be reported, even if it is done as an in-kind donation.

The following items have not been reported:

- cost of designing and updating his website
- cost of the graphic design for his logo
- cost of graphic design for what appears to be a walk card
- cost of treasury services performed by the treasurer on his C1, Rick Foster

# **10. LATE REPORTING OF EXPENDITURES, IN-KIND CONTRIBUTIONS, DEBT. (Violation of RCW 42.17A.235, .240)**

Mr. Schwartz placed two ads from his Facebook page that have not been reported on any C4 report. Facebook does not show the exact amount that was spent, but does note that the ads were both under \$100 and removed for not having a proper "Paid for by" disclaimer. Money spent on online advertising must be reported under Washington state law. Mr. Schwartz failed to report expenditures on two advertisements from July 2018 on his C4 report.

In addition to continuing to serve as a judge pro tem, since 2013 I've been serving full-time as an industrial appeals judge hearing workers' compensation appeals. In this position I ensure workers in our state are treated fairly and properly by the Department of Labor and Industries.



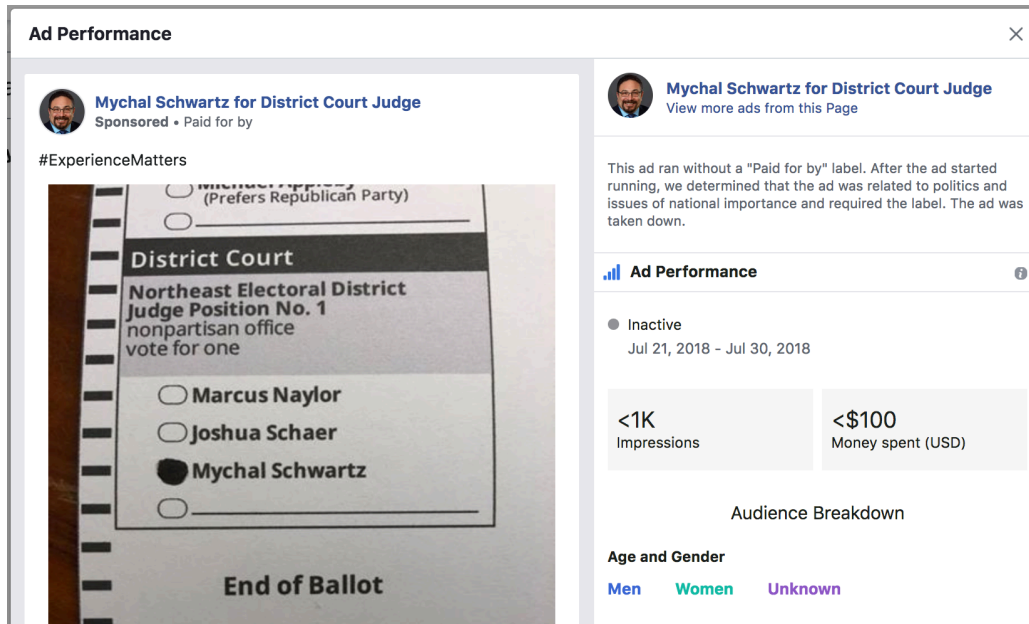
