Dear Dean Stafford:

The Public Disclosure Commission (PDC) has completed its initial review of the complaint you filed on July 31, 2018. Your complaint alleged that Sheriff Mark Nelson may have violated RCW 42.17A.555 by promoting a campaign at a public event on county property.

PDC staff reviewed your allegations and, as a result of staff's initial review, we found the following:

- Sheriff Nelson purchased, at the regular advertised price, sponsorship advertising (flag & banner) to be displayed at the Thunder Mountain Pro Rodeo in Cowlitz County.
- Thunder Mountain Pro Rodeo advertising/sponsorship opportunities are made available to any member of the public on a non-discriminatory, equal access basis.
- Per WAC 390-05.271, a public agency may make facilities available on a non-discriminatory, equal access basis for political uses if such action is a part of its regular and normal conduct; and the use of such access does not violate RCW 42.17A.555.

Based on these initial findings, staff has determined that, in this instance, no evidence supports a finding of a violation warranting further investigation.

The PDC has closed the matter, and will not be conducting a more formal investigation into your complaint or pursuing further enforcement action in this case.
