Dear Representative Pike:

Enclosed is a copy of a letter sent to Dmitri Iglitzin concerning a complaint he filed with the Public Disclosure Commission (PDC) on January 30, 2018. The complaint alleged that you may have violated RCW 42.17A.235 and .240 by failing to timely file Summary Campaign Contribution and Expenditure reports (C-4 reports) disclosing contribution and expenditure activities undertaken by your 2016 campaign for State Representative.

As noted in the letter to Mr. Iglitzin, the PDC will not be conducting a more formal investigation into these allegations or taking further enforcement action in this matter. However, pursuant to WAC 390-37-060(1)(b), this letter serves as a warning letter to you concerning the timely filing of C-4 reports for your 2018 candidacy for Clark County Council, and any campaigns in future years in accordance with PDC laws and rules. The Commission will consider this formal written warning in deciding on further Commission action if there are future violations of PDC laws or rules.

Subject: Complaint filed against Liz Pike, PDC Case 30918

Dear Mr. Iglitzin:

The Public Disclosure Commission (PDC) has completed its review of the complaint you filed on January 30, 2018. Your complaint alleged that that Liz Pike, an incumbent State Representative from the 18<sup>th</sup> Legislative District and a candidate seeking re-election to that office in 2016, may have violated RCW 42.17A.235 and .240 by failing to timely file Summary Campaign Contribution and Expenditure reports (C-4 reports) disclosing contribution and expenditure activities undertaken by her 2016 campaign.

PDC staff reviewed your allegations and as a result of our review, we found the following:

- On April 27, 2015, Liz Pike filed a Candidate Registration (C-1 report) declaring her candidacy for re-election to the office of State Representative from the 18<sup>th</sup> Legislative District in 2016, and selecting the Full Reporting Option.
- Staff reviewed the C-3 and C-4 reports filed by the Friends to Elect Liz Pike (Campaign) for the 2016 election, and the 13 C-4 reports listed in the complaint concerning her alleged failure to timely file the C-4 reports.
- Three of the alleged late filed C-4 reports for May of 2015, and January and February of 2016, each contained less than \$200 in contribution and expenditure activities, and were not a required report, so they were not late filed. In addition, two of the C-4 reports contained no expenditures, and the only activity was monetary contributions received which were timely disclosed on the C-3 reports.
- Five of the C-4 reports filed by the Campaign were filed between four to seven days late.
- Three C-4 reports were filed between 18 and 73 days late, including the: (1) April 2015 C-4 report which was filed 65 days late disclosing \$930 in contributions and no expenditures; (2) August 2015 C-4 report which was filed 18 days late disclosing \$1,100 in contributions and no expenditures; and (3) December 2016 C-4 report which was filed 73 days late disclosing \$9,215 in contributions and \$612 in expenditures made.
- Staff's review discovered that the 21-Day Pre-General Election C-4 report covering the period September 1 through October 17, 2016 was filed on October 24, 2016, six days late, disclosing \$25,144 in total contributions received and \$10,452 in expenditures made.

While the 21-Day Pre-General Election C-4 report was not alleged in the complaint, staff believes the report was the most critical of the late filed C-4 reports since it contained time sensitive contribution and expenditure information after the ballots had already been mailed out, and prior to the November 8, 2016 general election date. The late filed C-4 reports are mitigated by the fact the Campaign timely filed all Monetary Contributions reports (C-3 reports) for the 2016 election cycle, with many of the C-3 reports being filed electronically on the same day the contributions had been received and deposited.

Based on these findings, staff has determined that in this instance, failure to timely file the C-4 reports of contributions and expenditures referenced above, does not amount to a material violation warranting further investigation.

Pursuant to WAC 390-37-060(1)(b), Liz Pike will receive a formal written warning concerning failure to timely file C-4 reports as provided in RCW 42.17A.235. The formal written warning will include staff's expectation that Liz Pike timely files C-4 reports during 2018 for her candidacy for Clark County Council, and any future campaigns in accordance with PDC laws and rules. The Commission will consider the formal written warning in deciding on further Commission action if there are future violations of PDC laws or rules. The PDC has closed the matter, and will not be conducting a more formal investigation into your complaint or pursuing further enforcement action in this case.
