Subject: Complaint regarding Gregory Jones, PDC Case 23474

Dear Roger Lenk:

The Public Disclosure Commission (PDC) has completed its initial review of the complaint you filed on July 12, 2017. Your complaint alleged that Gregory Jones may have violated RCW 42.17A.235 and RCW 42.17A.205 by failing to timely file contributions, expenditures, and candidate registration.

PDC staff reviewed your allegations, and as a result of staff's initial review, we found the following:

- Gregory Jones failed to file the C-1 candidate registration within two weeks of declaring candidacy on May 15, 2017.
- Gregory Jones filed the missing C-1 when he realized that the report was late, prior to receiving the notification from the PDC.
- The C-1 report was filed on July 17, 2017 under the mini reporting option and was amended on October 5, 2017 and October 17, 2017.
- Gregory Jones acknowledged that the C-1 was late and corrected the noncompliance within five days of the PDC receiving the complaint.
- Since Gregory Jones filed the C-1 under the mini reporting option, he was not obligated to file C-3 and C-4 reports.

Based on these initial findings, staff has determined that in this instance, the failure to file the C-1 report does not amount to a material violation warranting further investigation.

PDC staff is reminding Gregory Jones about the importance of the timely disclosure of the C-1 candidate registration report, and the timely filing of all future PDC reports. The PDC has closed the matter, and will not be conducting a more formal investigation into your complaint or pursuing further enforcement action in this case.
