The mailer says return address of City of Liberty Lake. We are again concerned that our tax dollars are being spent on this campaign. I will attach pictures.

3) The group the sponsored last year, Friends of Town Square, just registered as a campaign group on 7/11. If they are behind all these signs, mailers, and ads, they have been campaigning for months without being registered.

Thanks so much. I hope you can look into this. We are concerned that the mayor is using the city and tax money to pay for this campaign.

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

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# Continuing the Legacy

LIBERTY LAKE TOWN SQUARE | VOTE AUG. 1

For decades, Liberty Lake has served as a vibrant and community that gathers together. The open space, the trails and other recreational attractions have helped craft the sense of community and high real property values among the highest in the region. But there is a gap. Through surveys and public input, residents have requested a central, year-round space for recreation, conversation and inspiration. Enter Liberty Lake Town Square. The project is being put before voters as a response to the community request.

## ABOUT THE PROJECT

Liberty Lake Town Square is planned for city-owned property adjacent to Town Square Park. The proposed community center is conditional upon approval from city of Liberty Lake voters, who will consider a \$7 million construction bond Aug. 1. The center would provide year-round community meeting space and coordinate city services. The facility would also serve as the relocated home of the city's library.

If approved, the 30-year bond would levy approximately \$0.30 per \$1,000 of assessed property value, or about \$101 per year on a home valued at \$270,000. As the city bond is issued, property value will grow over the life of the bond, the bond levy amount would decrease. Assuming an annual 1 percent growth in assessed property value, in 30 years the bond levy rate would have decreased to \$0.20 per \$1,000 of assessed property value.

### Q: Is there a goal of any sort in the long term?

A: No. Based upon feedback from residents, the pursuit of aquatic amenities is being investigated separately from Liberty Lake Town Square.

### Q: What will happen to the existing library structure if the bond is approved?

A: The current library space will be offered for lease to help offset operating costs.

### Q: What demographics do you anticipate benefiting the most from this facility?

A: From children's programs to team activities to continuing education for seniors, Liberty Lake Town Square is designed with flexibility for all.

## DID YOU KNOW...

- The meeting space at the existing Liberty Lake Municipal Library is used frequently - and often at capacity. It is not uncommon for people to be turned away from an event for lack of space.
- Community or recreation centers are common for cities of Liberty Lake's size. Cheney, slightly larger than Liberty Lake, operates a community center, and Keweenaw Heights, slightly smaller, is in the process of constructing a \$10 million recreation complex.
- According to the Liberty Lake Historical Society, the community enjoys a legacy of "100 years of Gathering, Recreation and Music." As early as the 1850s, the Coeur d'Alene Indian Tribe would host annual gatherings at Liberty Lake for feasting, horse racing and music. In the early 1900s Liberty Lake was a resort destination branded as "Spokane's Island Seashore."

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
